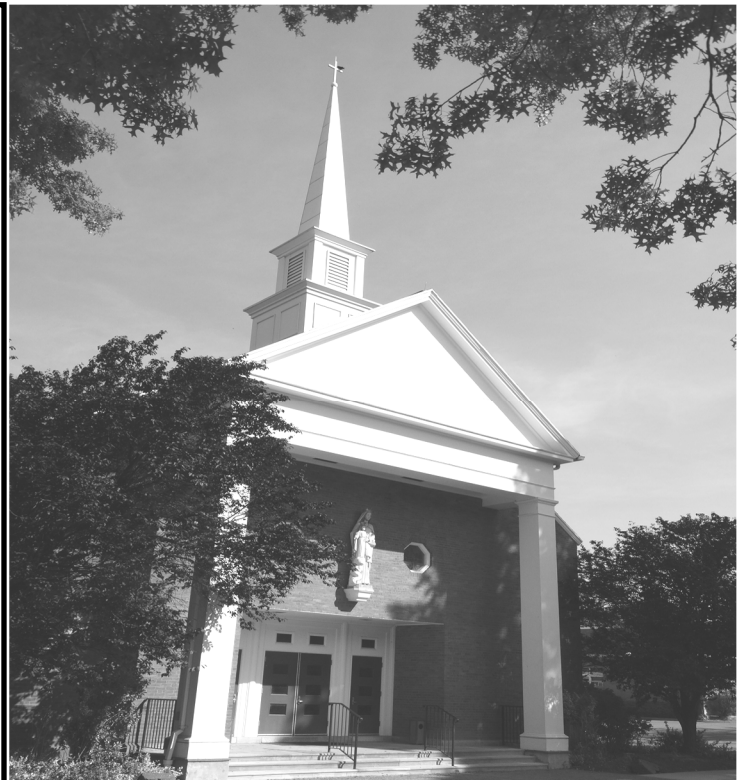

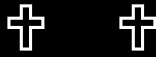

Where Can We Find Peace

There is not a person alive who does not wish for Peace. Peace in the world, peace in their families and peace of mind in life itself. It tends to be an elusive commodity. Something which seems no matter how hard we try the more it becomes unattainable. During the 1960s and 1970s people marched for peace and wore clothes to advertise their desire for peace. Yet it still seems to be simply something hoped for.

Peace is a state of mind that gradually seeps into one's being through a life focused more on meeting the needs of others. Speak to the many healthcare workers who sacrifice their needs and personal feelings to tend to the needs of their patients. Speak to the tens of thousands of volunteers across the country who give their time to help others. Many of those who work with people needing medical help or volunteer helping others in different ways have needs themselves that are administered by others.

St Paul in his Letter to the Ephesians in today's readings tells us that Christ is Peace. Christ's personal needs never deterred him from his mission of reaching out to others. He no doubt recognized the needs of his apostles and disciples. As we saw in last week's gospel he sent them out two by two to spread the good news of love and caring. His advice was that they do their best to spread the good news. He also advised his apostles that if they were not accepted by some they were to move on and find others who would welcome them.

As Christians and through the Sacrament of Baptism we are called into this world to proclaim the Gospel message. How we live our lives, treat others and respond to their needs is our way of proclaiming the Good News. It is in our response to this call that we recognize God's love and mercy. Jesus' own rejection by his family and apostles did not lead him to despair but as we see in our Gospel this weekend to a greater response to the Father in prayer. Jesus is moved with "pity" for the people he meets. The Prince of Peace is not without understanding our needs. He knows fully the feeling of emptiness and abandonment but that leads him to God in deeper prayer and continuing to meet the needs of those he meets.

As imitators of Christ we are sent out to be peace for others. Our caring for the needs of others proclaiming God's love and mercy has a calming affect not only on the people we meet but will provide us with the peace and calm we seek in our own lives. There is an old saying which says "what goes around comes around". Those that spread peace are those that receive peace in return.

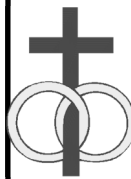

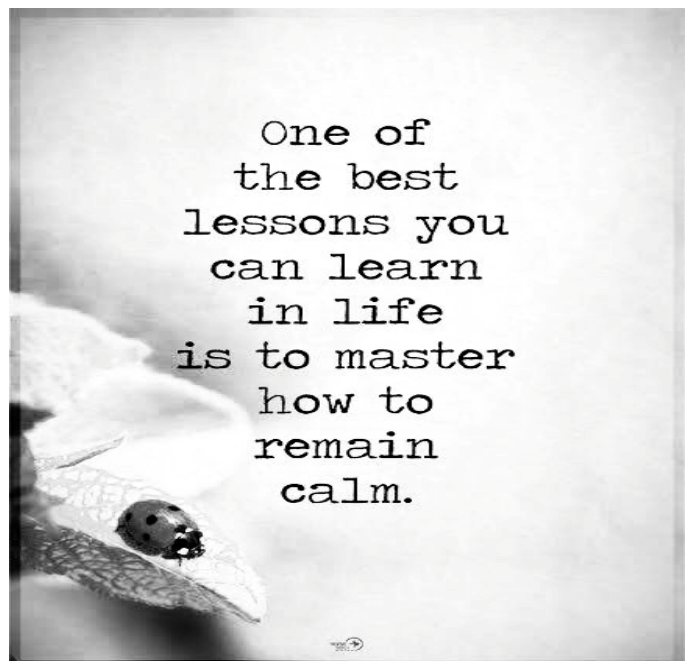
TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

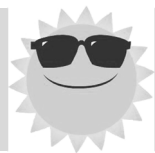
The American Revolution cleared the way for freedom of religion in the former colonies, since the colonies had always been a more religiously tolerant place than the old country. Even so, colonial laws restricted the practice of the Catholic faith, and just as in England, Americans who desired to be priests or nuns had to go to the Netherlands or France. As political storm clouds gathered in France, an American woman, Mother Bernardina Matthews, the prioress of the Hoogstraeten Carmel in Holland, made a brave move. With two other American nuns, her nieces, and a Dutch sister, she came to Port Tobacco, Maryland, in 1790. Within twenty years the community had grown to twenty, although by 1823 their farm failed and they had to move to Baltimore and open a school. The Carmelite order requires contemplation and cloister, so in time the school was closed. The Port Tobacco land had long since been sold, but in 1976 a community of nuns was able to return thanks to loyal neighbors who had worked for forty years for their restoration. Today, our original American convent is fully alive in prayer, hard work, and strong community.

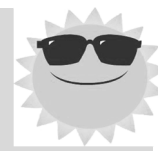

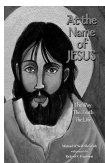

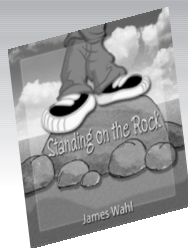
