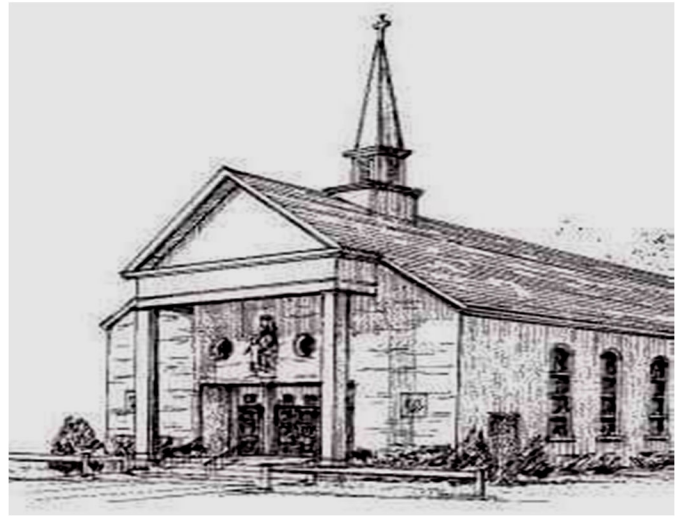

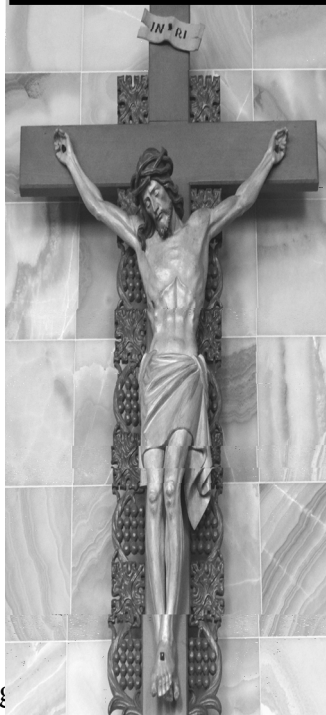

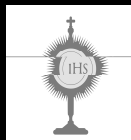

Staying Informed: Our Future

“Since God created the world, He also created reality.” -- Pope Francis

Without a doubt, our Parish family has experienced many challenges in the last few years. As the Archdiocese continues to assess its Catholic communities, we can expect more to come. In an effort to keep us all knowledgeable and up-to-date with the latest information about our future, this column will appear each week.

WHERE WE STAND: Since February, our parishioners, Fr. Dillon and our Archdiocesan contacts have been exploring and brainstorming ways for us to move forward despite financial and building maintenance difficulties. The grounds and buildings of both Our Lady of Victory Church and St. John Vianney Church have been appraised and assessed with the help of H. Pearce Realty and other market experts. Their reports and our parish recommendation were submitted to the Archdiocesan decision-makers and have been accepted. We have permission to move forward our plan, as outlined here.

OUR PARISH PLAN: “After discussion with parishioners and parish leaders, our best course of action will be to sell the Our Lady of Victory property and relocate the parish to 300 Captain Thomas Boulevard,” says Fr. Dillon. This is the recommendation he submitted to the Archdiocese and the one with which we are proceeding.

Fr. Dillon said the appraisals show that the buildings currently on the St. John Vianney campus need very little work in order to serve the parish community. The buildings on the Victory campus (including the school, rectory, convent and church), face a long list of expensive “fixes”:

Replacement of the heating and air conditioning system in the church

New roofs on all buildings

Water damage

Utility expenses for maintaining all four buildings and the grounds continue to rise

Parking lot and walkway repair

“As we work with our Realtor and Archdiocesan lawyers to put the church and grounds on the market, I know you will join me in prayer for its successful sale. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we head into our future with hope and openness to what the Holy Spirit has in store for us.”

NEXT STEPS: In the coming weeks, Our Lady of Victory Church and grounds will officially be put up for sale. The parish community of Our Lady of Victory will move to 300 Captain Thomas Boulevard pending it’s sale. Watch this space for updates.





TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The wonderful diversity of life and worship among Roman Catholics of East and West is an example of God writing straight with crooked lines. The steady hand of the villainous Emperor Diocletian drew a line across Europe and Africa that split the empire in two, and for the most part determined how Christians would worship two thousand years later.



Italy's heel and the far northern city of Trieste fell on the Eastern side, and have had a form of Eastern liturgy ever since. Constantinople, which soon became the seat of the Roman Empire, became a base for Christianizing the East up to Russia and Poland. Poland was on the Eastern side, but a series of wars and medieval mayhem pushed the religious boundary back to the Ukraine, and Poland remains an outpost of the Latin Church to this day.

An old rule of thumb declared that whatever religion was observed by the local prince, the people had to follow. This gave rise to persecution and migration as people sought toleration for their expressions of faith. In the United States, we are accustomed to peaceful collaboration among Christians of East and West, a situation that challenges churches that still feel the pinch of age-old division.
