Staying Informed: Our Future

Staying Informed: The Ministries of the Beacon on the Hill

“We are not living in an era of change, but a change of era.” – Pope Francis

In an effort to keep us all knowledgeable and up-to-date with the latest information about our future, this column will appear each week.

THE PROCESS OF SELLING THE PROPERTY AS OF NOV. 19: The 10-acres of the Our Lady of Victory property, including the rectory, church, school and convent, has been listed for sale at \$1.85 million. According to Fr. Dillon, there have been multiple showings by our realtor.

THE CLOTHES CLOSET: In preparation for the sale of the property up on the hill at 634 Jones Hill Road, co-directors Roseann Gulisano and Barbara Messina have been working hard to relocate the individual services offered by the Beacon on the Hill, our community outreach center. “This is giving our parish the opportunity to do something with West Haven’s interfaith community,” said Roseann, “And we are so happy it is working out that way.”

The Clothes Closet, its clothing and racks are moving to The Vertical Church, 225 Meloy Road. “We are so pleased that they are taking this on in its entirety,” said Barbara. The Clothes Closet is expected to be closed by the end of the year. In 2020, please continue to support this ministry by bringing your clothing donations to The Vertical Church.

“Most importantly,” said Roseann, “we want to continue to serve the population we currently serve. We do not want these families to go without the things they need most. Having these other churches so close to us come forward helps the mission of the Beacon to continue.”

Fr. Dillon says that as a parish family we will continue to support those in need in our community. He said to watch for the Giving Tree during Advent, upcoming holiday food drives and diaper drives to continue throughout the year.

FOOD PANTRY AND MEDICAL EQUIPMENT CLOSET: Space restrictions at our new location on Captain Thomas Boulevard will also require us to discontinue our Food Pantry and Medical Equipment collections. W.H.E.A.T. will be the recipient of any food we have stored at the end of the year. We are currently reaching out to other area churches who have space available for storing medical equipment, which takes up a lot of room.

THE DIAPER BANK: Barbara Messina has been working with the New Life Evangelical Free Church to transition the Diaper Bank to their premises at 255 Jones Hill Road. This is the church located on the corner of South St. and Jones Hill Road.

“I’m really going to miss having all of these services under one roof,” said Roseann, “but I’m happy that our parishioners can continue to support those in need by donating to these nearby houses of faith. Our volunteers have done a phenomenal job over the years,” said Roseann. “And I’m happy to hear that some of these angels will continue to volunteer at the new locations.”

Without a doubt, the parish family of Our Lady of Victory has experienced numerous challenges in the last few years. In 2019, parishioners, Fr. Dillon and Archdiocesan contacts explored ways to move forward despite financial and building maintenance difficulties. It was decided the best course of action was to sell the Our Lady of Victory property and relocate the parish to 300 Captain Thomas Boulevard. The property was listed for sale and there have been multiple showings. The mission of the Beacon on the Hill will continue to help the population they serve in different locations. The Diaper Bank will transition over to the New Life Evangelical Free Church on Jones Hill Road; The Clothes Closet will be managed by the Vertical Church on 225 Meloy Road; W.H.E.A.T. will be the recipient of any food stored at the end of the year. The Beacon is currently reaching out to other area churches who have space for storing medical equipment. It has been a pleasure dealing with the West Haven inter-faith community.

However, the spirit was still alive and well at Our Lady of Victory in 2019

Parishioners continued to generously support the **Food Pantry, Diaper Bank, Clothes Closet, Giving Tree** and the **Annual Fund**. Many parishioners are helping Deacon Dean in the **Midnight Run**. **The Lenten Soup Supper Speaker series and Multi-Cultural Pot Luck Luncheon** were all very well attended and a great success. **In April**, our community gathered to offer incredible support and generosity to our dear parishioner, Kelly Armour. The usual good weather of the third week of July for the **62nd Annual Carnival** was anything but, with rain, stifling record heat, and off the charts humidity! However, the legions of many volunteers persevered. Although the carnival fell short of being the financial success, it was a reminder that much goodwill is alive in this community. Early October we had the annual **Blessings of the Animals** and on **October 6th**, we overwhelmingly showed our appreciation to the Ursuline Sisters' at a very successful fundraising Brunch to help defray relocation costs for the Sisters moving expenses. **The All Souls Mass** on November 4th remembered all our beloved dead especially those who died in 2019. Approximately 550 luminaries (thank you K of C) dotted the perimeter of the Church. The beautiful liturgy and luminaries provided a powerful and prayerful reminder of our dearly departed. On November 30th, parishioners participated in a new enjoyable event, **Advent Wreath Making Workshop**. On December 5th our Knights of Columbus Council presented the annual parish **Sing-along**. It was a well attended fun filled event. Highlighting the year was the stellar performance by our Music Ministry (this year we were joined by the choir of St. John XXIII) at the **Annual Lessons & Carols** on December 8th. The Church was full with an appreciative crowd who enjoyed a gift of peaceful, prayerful and wonderful music during the busy holiday season. The year ended with a most valued ministry –**Plant Delivery to the Homebound**. It is our parish community's way of thanking those who no longer can join us. Lilies are delivered at Easter and poinsettias during Christmas. **We are so very blessed by the time, treasure and talent given by OLOV parishioners. Their selflessness makes overcoming our challenges meaningful.**

As we journey into a new decade and into a new home, may we keep in mind that our parish family is not defined by a building but rather Our Lady of Victory's faith and generous spirit. Family is where we gather. "How good it is, how pleasant, where the people dwell as one (Psalm 133:1)

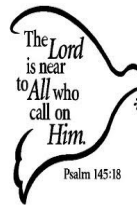

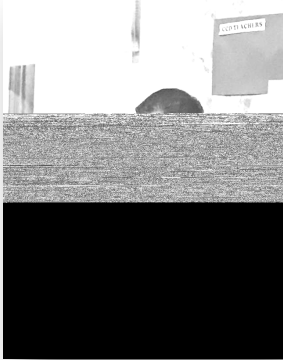

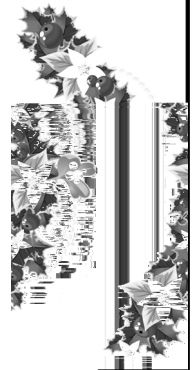

The Epiphany of the Lord

Little Drummer Boy

Did you know that the only reason we say that there were three wise men is that they brought three gifts? The Bible never says their number or their names. The gifts tell us about the givers. And these special gifts--gold, frankincense, and myrrh--tell us much.



When one king visited or sent an ambassador to another, he would give a gift of gold to show that he acknowledged the kingship of the other. So the first gift of the wise men tells us they recognized Jesus as King. The second gift is a type of incense, which was used in Jesus time to worship God. So this gift shows the wise men paying homage to Jesus' divinity. The gift of myrrh is oil used to anoint the dying. It reminds us of Jesus suffering and death on the cross.

So what gifts do we have for Jesus? Maybe we can take a hint from the wise men. If we acknowledge Jesus as king, maybe a better gift than gold would be to pledge our obedience to him. Each day we can promise to live our vocation as best we can, to love those around us, and forgive those who hurt us.

A better way than burning incense to pay homage to Jesus' divinity is to take time to pray throughout the day. Some people are able to attend daily Mass, others spend time in adoration before the Eucharist, or even a few minutes of their lunch break to say the rosary.

As for the gift of myrrh, we can give Jesus the crosses we bear each day. When we accept suffering in our lives, especially that caused by our sins, we give ourselves to Jesus as he gave himself for us on the cross.

The song "Little Drummer Boy" reminds us that the best gift is not necessarily the most expensive. Instead, it is the simple gift that only we can give. Let Epiphany remind us to offer our lives to Jesus each day.

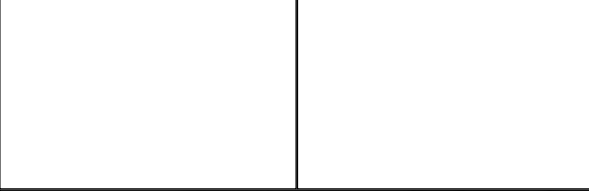
