My dear Parishioners,

Holy Week is the time on the liturgical calendar that I most look forward to. I always find that Holy Week is a profoundly spiritually moving time. What makes it so moving for me is that each of the liturgies has a very specific focus and that the liturgies have so many elements that are different from what we do at any other liturgy throughout the year.

This year, as we know, Holy Week will be different than any other year's celebrations. Because of the Covid-19 pandemic, you will have to participate in the liturgies remotely and I will celebrate them in a nearly empty church. In some ways, I guess the empty church will be symbolic of the road to Calvary and Jesus' Crucifixion and Death on the Cross. But as we all so well know, Jesus' death is not the end of the story because it is always followed by the new life of Easter and all the promises that come with Easter.

I urge all of us to never lose sight of the fact that, even when things seem dark, when facing fear and unknown and when feeling alone, there is a new and greater day that awaits us, the challenge is enduring until that day arrives. With faith we can do it.

During this year's Holy Week, I invite all of us to unite ourselves in a new way to the mysteries that are presented before us during the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. It is my hope that everyone will put aside the time this year to worship remotely and spend time in prayer. And as you participate via your television or computer, please remember, in this time of pandemic, to pray for all who are ill with Covid-19, all who care for them, all healthcare professionals and all who are researching treatments and governmental leaders. We all know the power that prayer has and I truly believe that during Holy Week prayer takes on an added power; especially as we participate in whatever way possible with our sacred liturgies.

Finally, although it is my least favorite thing to do, I have to ask, if it is possible at this time, for your continued financial support of our parish. Our parish pretty much lives weekly collection to weekly collection, now that this revenue has stopped, we are watching what little savings we have decrease each week. Any contribution that you can make is greatly appreciated and will help us in getting through this crisis.

Be assured of my prayers for you and your families, that you will all remain healthy and safe. I do miss seeing you all every week and look forward to the day when will gather together again in the temple of the Lord to celebrate as God's people of faith.

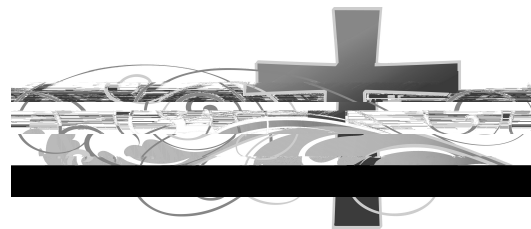

## With God All Things Are Possible

As we enter the third week of self-confinement many of us now realize that the world as we know it has taken a dramatic turn. While we here in the United States are only in our third week, China and Italy have been self-confined for two months or more. Boredom, concern, anxiety and perhaps depression has set in for many. Radical changes have occurred for the entire world population. Illness, loss of jobs, fear and anxiety now intrudes into our lives and has replaced the everyday routine we have all become accustomed to. We wonder, when will it end? What will it be like when we again can leave our homes without the fear of the virus? Jesus in Mt 19:26 utters the words "With people this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Our Gospel for this past Sunday, the Fifth Sunday in Lent, dealt with Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. In the extended reading of the Gospel, Jesus focused on doing the will of God. Jesus displayed both trust and obedience not in his own power but in his Father's. He demonstrated that anything he does comes from the Father. Despite this trust, Jesus shows a very human side of himself when he weeps for the death of his friend Lazarus. He is not without love and concern for his friends. He understands the heartbreak of Mary and Martha. He knows that the death of his friend Lazarus means the loss of his presence in his life. We have all experienced loss of family and friends and sought God's help through prayer for those who have died and for their families. Not through Jesus' power alone but through His prayer to the Father does Lazarus live.

All across the world prayers are being said for an end to this pandemic; for the people who are sick, those who have died and for their families. We are praying for all those working to fight this disease and find a cure. Christians, Jews and Muslims, people of all faiths, are seeking intercession by God through prayer to get us through this. Worldwide, people of every faith are forgetting their ties to this earthly life and seeking God's intervention. We need to recognize, through our own prayers, that God will lead us to recovery. We become more aware of our own powerlessness and recognize that only through God's help and intervention will we succeed in ending the sickness and death that now plagues the world. The LORD is my strength and my shield, in whom my heart trusts. I am helped, so my heart rejoices; with my song I praise him (Ps 28:7). Yet, St Paul implores us, we should pray without ceasing (1Th 5).

# Christ Lives!

An apostolic exhortation is a form of communication from the pope that usually encourages the People of God to some form of action or prayer. Last spring, Pope Francis published an apostolic exhortation entitled **Christus Vivit** or **Christ Lives!**

It was addressed to young people and also to all persons of faith and goodwill. It is a document of great beauty and a serious invitation for renewed prayer, discernment, and discipleship. As we celebrate Easter this year in the midst of the Covid 19 Virus Pandemic, this message has special meaning and importance. Let us sit with this today, Easter 2020 in the safety of our homes and reflect upon the opening passage of this crucial call to prayer and action.

## **Christ is alive!**

He is our hope,

**and in a wonderful way,**

**he brings youth to our world,**

**and everything he touches**

**becomes young, new, and full of life.**

**The very first words that I wish to say to every Christian are these:**

**Christ is alive and he wants you to be alive!**

**He is in you, he is with you, he never abandons you.**

However far you may wander,

he is always there, **the Risen One.**

He calls you and he waits for you

to return to him and start over.

When you feel that you are growing old

out of sorrow, resentment, fear, doubt, or failure,

he will always be there

to restore your strength and your hope



Pope Francis appreciates and understands the challenges associated with living a life of faith in the modern world and the particular challenges associated with passing that faith along to our children, grandchildren, and godchildren. At the same time, the Holy Father reminds us of three important truths that we should keep close to our hearts and share with others, both young and old.

First, God loves you!

Second, Jesus sacrificed himself on the cross for you and for all people everywhere!

And finally, **Christ is alive!**

With these truths rooted in our hearts and minds, we can have confidence that “goodness will have the upper hand” in our lives and that “all of our struggles will prove worthwhile” because all things are possible, all challenges can be overcome, and all will be well because Jesus is alive and ever present in our world. Such confidence is the product of our dedication to prayer, our diligence in good works, and our sincere love for God and for each other.

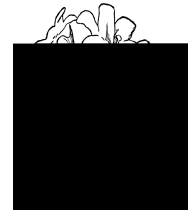

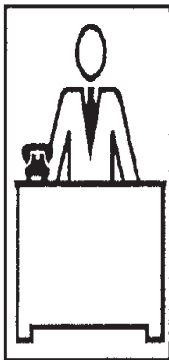
