Better Days to Come

A letter from Fr. Dillon

Dear Parishioners,

Recently, I've been encountering a lot of people experiencing COVID-19 fatigue. So many of us, including me, are plain worn out by this virus that just won't quit. There seems to be no end in sight, and little, if any, promising news out there regarding anything an end to this scourge.

I, too, am tired of the precautions we must take to protect ourselves and others. There are places that I want to go and people with whom I want to spend time and I haven't been able to do so since mid-March. If you're in this same place, we find ourselves just not knowing what to do.

A couple of suggestions come to mind; they work for me, hopefully they may benefit you as well. As always, the first is to pray that the Good Lord will give you patience and that He will help to calm your anxieties and ease your fears. Try spending a little time in quiet meditation, prayer, devotional practices or just being in the presence of God.

The second thing is something I do when I travel on a long journey: I don't focus just on the destination, which may take many hours or days to get to. I always look at the trip in segments and just focus on completing that one segment. For me, it makes the trip less daunting

and easier to endure.

In applying this to our present situation with the pandemic, I suggest that we make small calendar benchmarks. Right now, we have dispensation from Sunday Mass which concludes on November 28. Should that date come and we are in the same position, then choose a new benchmark date: maybe Christmas or New Year's. If things still remain the same, go for Valentine's Day and continue doing this until the virus is finally contained and hopefully beat. Emotionally and psychologically, we have to do what we can to keep strong and get through this.

Once COVID-19 has been defeated and we are assured it is safe to gather, I would like to have a "Good-bye to COVID" parish celebration. It may be in the form of a parish picnic, where we can get together, without masks, and enjoy each other's company in a relaxed and fun atmosphere. As part of this celebration, I think it would be appropriate to have a fire-pit which we can all throw our masks into as a sign of our triumph over this dreaded virus. I propose this today because I want us to have something to look forward to once we get past this.

We've now come to an annual ritual that I don't like: returning to Standard Time. I really don't like when it gets dark so early, it seems to take so long for the amount of daylight to grow once we pass the solstice in December. Like everything else, we shall get through it and a new day shall arise. Let's all keep looking forward in hope for better days.

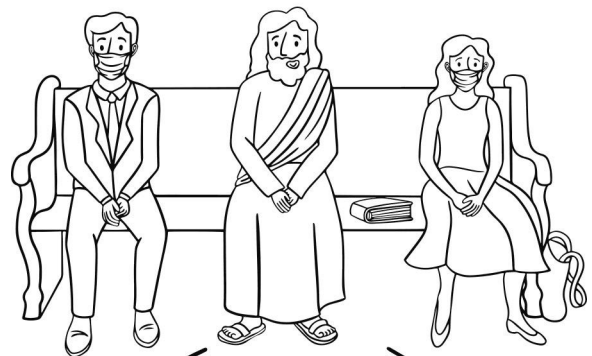

All Saints

This weekend we celebrate the eve of the veneration of the saints of the church (Halloween), the veneration (All Saints), followed immediately by the feast of All Souls in which we honor those family and friends who have gone before us. This annual commemoration coincides with the end of the year--the harvest, the reaping of the reward for hard work in the field of life. These saints and souls that we commemorate sowed in the field of life and now reap the harvest of Eternal Life as promised in our Gospels.

Those who have gone before us have endured with patience the joys and the challenges that life brings. We are touched by the people we meet in life, whether they be family, friend or a saint whose life resonates with us. We take on certain characteristics that we find admirable. We honor them by doing this because we show appreciation for what their life means to us. Imitating a saint or someone close to us is a way we learn to love. As the writer Oscar Wilde once said, "Imitation is the greatest form of flattery."

As the saints are honored by the Church as imitators of Christ, so we are called to do the same. Yet as we read the lives of the saints, we learn that they struggled in and matters of life and faith as we do. Their difference from us lies in they held true to their faith in God and the example of Jesus Christ amidst all the difficulties dealt them. Be it physical pain (in the case of the martyrs) or struggles of faith (in the case of many other saints), they held onto what they knew to be true: the promise of Resurrection!

Our family and friends who we honor during these days now know that their struggles were not in vain. The joys we shared with these people always came along with the challenges of life. Taken all together, it is the promise of Eternal Life and the love of family and friends that keep us going.



The Beatitudes in the gospel this weekend have a calming effect against the struggles of life. As we continually try to imitate the life of Christ, we know that practicing His virtues not only helps others, but also the people

that love us and whom we love. They, too, face the same struggles, but when we practice the virtues of the Beatitudes, we allow others to see an example that they can follow.

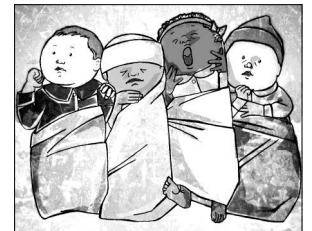

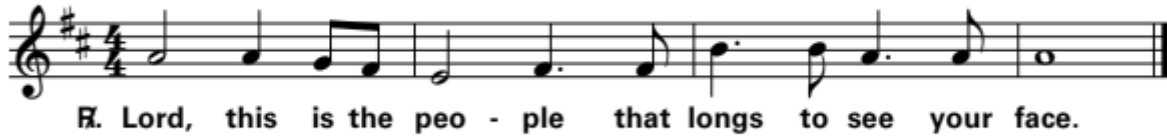

The vocalists are masked when not singing and they all have their own books so there is no sharing of music. Any additional music is scanned and sent to them. They also receive recordings, so they can prepare to the best of their ability on

their own. They review briefly before any service at which they sing. Best of all, the youth choir members have also been involved in this process.

It has been a challenge for the music ministry, but they are meeting that challenge while still maintaining the integrity of the program. We look forward to the day when we can all sing together, and the congregation can join them in "singing a joyful song!"

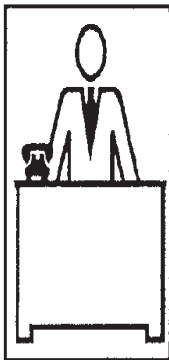
