






Eucharistic Adoration

Worshipping During a Pandemic

A letter from Fr. Dillon

Dear Parishioners,

Once again, I thank all of you for being so vigilant and cooperative regarding the wearing of masks while in church and following all of the pandemic protocols that have been established by the Archdiocese of Hartford. I've said it before and I'll say it again, I'm sure every time I mention masks during the weekly announcements, you think: "There he goes again." I think it, too. Unfortunately, COVID-19 cases are climbing rapidly nationwide and positivity rates and hospitalizations in Connecticut keep growing as well. We all know, and the leading scientists tell us, that proper mask wearing is one of our best defenses we have during the pandemic. Keep up the good work, pray for the good health of all: it helps everyone.

With the above being said, I was informed last week that a person who attended a funeral here on Friday, November 6, tested positive for COVID-19. We have posted a notice on our social media platforms and the funeral home was informed as well. Each week you hear me make an announcement regarding the wearing of face-masks and I make a more detailed announcement at the start of each funeral. Here is how we,

as a community, are keeping safe during this time:

- As you know we are very diligent in the cleansing of the church after any event that takes place; this is also true following daily Mass and funerals.
 - For my part, I do not have any physical contact with any person: I refuse to do fist bumps or elbow taps. I'm sure that you have noted that when distributing Holy Communion, I drop the host into the hand of the communicant so as to avoid contact.
 - We do not have lectors or Extra-Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion so as to keep contact to a minimum as well.
- I believe that we are properly doing everything that has been recommended to us so that we may stay ahead of the virus. Should any other developments arise I will certainly keep you informed of them.

Despite all of the "heavy" news this week, I hope that this coming week is a pleasant one.

Extension of Dispensation from Sunday Mass Obligation

Now through Feb. 16, 2021

On March 13, 2020, each and every Catholic in the Archdiocese of Hartford was dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass by Archbishop Leonard P. Blair due to the potential danger of the coronavirus pandemic. In light of continued uncertainty regarding the extent and duration of the pandemic in the state of Connecticut and throughout the Archdiocese of Hartford, Archbishop Blair has now extended this dispensation from the Sunday obligation through Saturday, February 16, 2021.

The Archdiocese of Hartford continues to monitor the severity of the situation and will provide updates regarding decisions reached for the archdiocese as they are made.

Being What God Wants Us to Be

Our first reading begins with a refreshing passage from Proverbs proclaiming the value of wives. We have heard, throughout history, of many famous men attributing their success to the support their wives have given them. Women have always been in the forefront of influencing men in their decisionmaking. I can personally attest to the support my wife has given me in nearly 34 years of being a Deacon. It is an undeniable fact, and I believe many of my brother Deacons will agree, that our ministries would never have begun without the support and sacrifices made by our wives and families.

This is true of Catholic Deacons who are married clergy, and also the clergy of other faiths in which ministers are allowed to be married. History and scripture have shown us many examples of the influence of women and their assistance to men who have lived out their lives attempting to help others either in their faith or in public office.

Fortunately, in the second half of the 20th Century, women began to emerge in public life and clerical life of other faiths to offer their talents in a more complete and equal role. The United States even has its first woman and first female minority in the Executive branch of our government as Vice-President-Elect.

God has created all of us equal. Racial equality has taken far too long to enter into American culture, so too has it taken far too long for gender equality to gain equal footing. May all segments of life -- religious, public and corporate -- fully acknowledge the equality of *all* God's children. It is only through the voices of *all* people that balance and harmony can be accomplished.

Our Gospel today focuses on just that issue: Using all the talents available to us. Many years ago, I attended a play that centered around the experience of explorers. The explorers in the


play dreamt of successfully reaching their destination but also how they dealt with their fears, especially the fear of surviving in harsh weather and terrain. In one scene, an explorer speaks of his fears as they all try to make a decision on how to proceed. The decision is whether to continue forward, facing possible starvation and death, with the hope of

the success versus retreating and returning to safe ground. One explorer states, “God created us for a purpose with specific talents and responsibilities. It can be a single moment in our life or a lifetime commitment, but we must define ourselves by doing as God is calling us to do. We must never hesitate to use the gifts that are uniquely ours, given to us by God.”

Jesus' parable today separates those who are obedient and are willing to take risks to make a better world. The parable condemns those who sit back expecting life to fulfill their expectations without ever attempting themselves to improve on the world as it currently exists.


