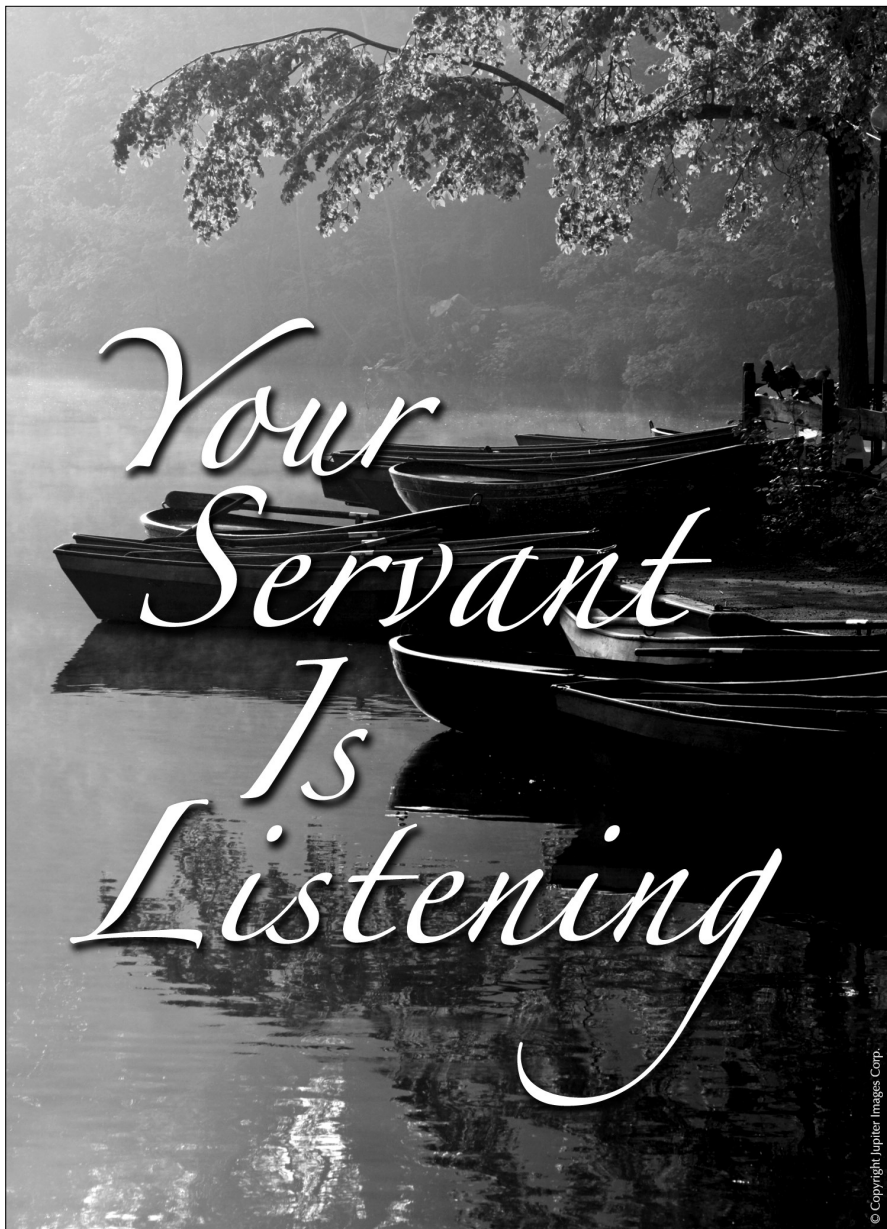

Pray for the Preservation of Peace and Justice

A letter from Fr. Dillon



As we know, we are facing heightened tensions in our country right now. Many of us have serious concerns about what will happen next. It is during times like these that we are called to unite in one thing -- prayer.

We all know the power of prayer. Our parish name, "Our Lady of Victory," is a title that was given to the Blessed Mother after Pope Pius V asked for prayers in 1571, so that the Papal Naval Forces would be victorious in a battle with the Ottoman Army who were seeking to sack Rome. The Holy Father asked that the faithful recite the rosary so Rome would be spared. They did and the Papal forces were victorious, saving the city. Prayer brought the victory and kept Rome safe. Prayer has power. There is no prayer too small or insignificant: just pray.

During Ordinary Time, on days that do not have a specific celebration attached to them, the priest-celebrant may choose from many different Mass themes. With the return to Ordinary Time on January 11, I've decided to use the prayers of the Mass "For the Preservation of Peace and Justice." As we know, the highest prayer that the Church has is the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist. It is from this celebration that the highest forms of grace flow. Every Mass begins with a penitential rite. There

are various options that may be used and I offer the one below to be included in your daily prayers at this time. The Penitential Rite and the Collect shown here are prayers of the Mass "For the Preservation of Peace and Justice."

May we all embrace the power of prayer to ease the tensions of the present time.

Penitential Rite III:

Lord Jesus, you came to reconcile us to one another and to the Father: Lord have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you heal the wounds of sin and division: Christ have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you intercede for us with your Father: Lord have mercy.

Collect:

O God of peace, who are peace itself
And whom a spirit of discord cannot grasp,
Nor a violent mind receive,
Grant that those who are one in heart
May persevere in what is good
And that those in conflict
May forget evil and so be healed.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
Who lives and reigns with you
In unity with the Holy Spirit,
One God, forever and ever. Amen.

Here I Am Lord

The inspiring story of the call of Samuel begins not with the story from today's first reading, but from Chapter 1 of the book. Samuel's mother Hannah was advanced in age and had no children. She prayed frequently in the Temple, asking God to bless her with a son. It is a story of unwavering faith despite criticism from family members. Her faith makes her more determined to seek God's blessing. She promises God that if He were to give her a male child, she would give him to the Lord.

As we see in this reading, Samuel was given to Hannah as the result of her faith and commitment. As promised, Samuel is given to God in the Temple as a minister to the priest Eli. One night while sleeping, Samuel hears his name called. He responded to Eli the High Priest, thinking that it was him calling. Eli tells him to go back to sleep. Again, Samuel hears his name and Eli tells him to go back to sleep. The third time Samuel hears his name, he realizes it is the Lord calling him. Samuel obediently acknowledges God's call and speaks to the people of Israel. They acknowledge him as a prophet

*"Before I formed you
in the womb, I knew you;
before you were born,
I appointed you a prophet
to the nations .
— Jeremiah 1:5*

proclaiming the words that God has given him.

Our Gospel today continues the theme of God's call to His people. Jesus begins His ministry after His Baptism and John the Baptist recognizes Jesus is God's Chosen One. John diminishes his ministry while Jesus' begins His.

John's followers, realizing the truth in John's word, leave him to follow Jesus. As John's followers' approach Jesus, they call him Rabbi (teacher) and they seek to learn from Him. Jesus invites them listen and stay with Him for a time. Andrew, one of those new followers, searches out his brother Simon (Peter) and acknowledges that

"we have found the Messiah (Anointed)."

In the Sacrament of Baptism we are *all* called by God to grow in faith and be examples of Christ's love for all people. Some are called to the priesthood, the diaconate or religious life, but *everyone* is called by God to learn from Jesus as their teacher. Through the grace of Baptism, our call is to be examples of faith and charity.

The call of Samuel and the disciples of Jesus is the same call that we receive in our lives to become proclaimers of God's Word. We respond by the example we set by our actions. Our gift of life is a call to discipleship and our response is to be followers of Jesus' example and proclaim His words so others may hear God's call to them.

Please Pray for Vocations

If two of you join your voices on earth to pray for anything whatever, it shall be granted you by my Father in heaven. Where only a few come together in Christ's name on earth, Christ is present with them.

Pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, religious life and diaconate.

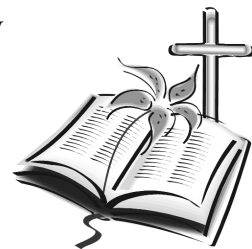

The Archdiocese of Hartford continues to monitor the severity of the situation and will provide updates regarding decisions reached for the archdiocese as they are made.

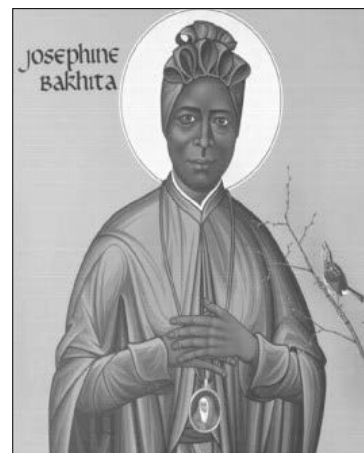
Pray to End Human Trafficking

Its victims...are among the poorest and most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters.”

Since we are unable to host a “Prayer Service to End Human Trafficking” as in the past, the Social Justice Committee of St. John XXIII/ Our Lady of Victory Parishes invites you to become aware of this travesty and to pray for an end to it through the intercession of St.

Josephine Bakhita, whose Feast Day is February 8. Canonized by Pope St. John Paul II in 2000, St. Josephine was enslaved in Africa and Italy. Upon gaining her freedom, she joined the Canossian Daughters of Charity and became an advocate for those enslaved.
