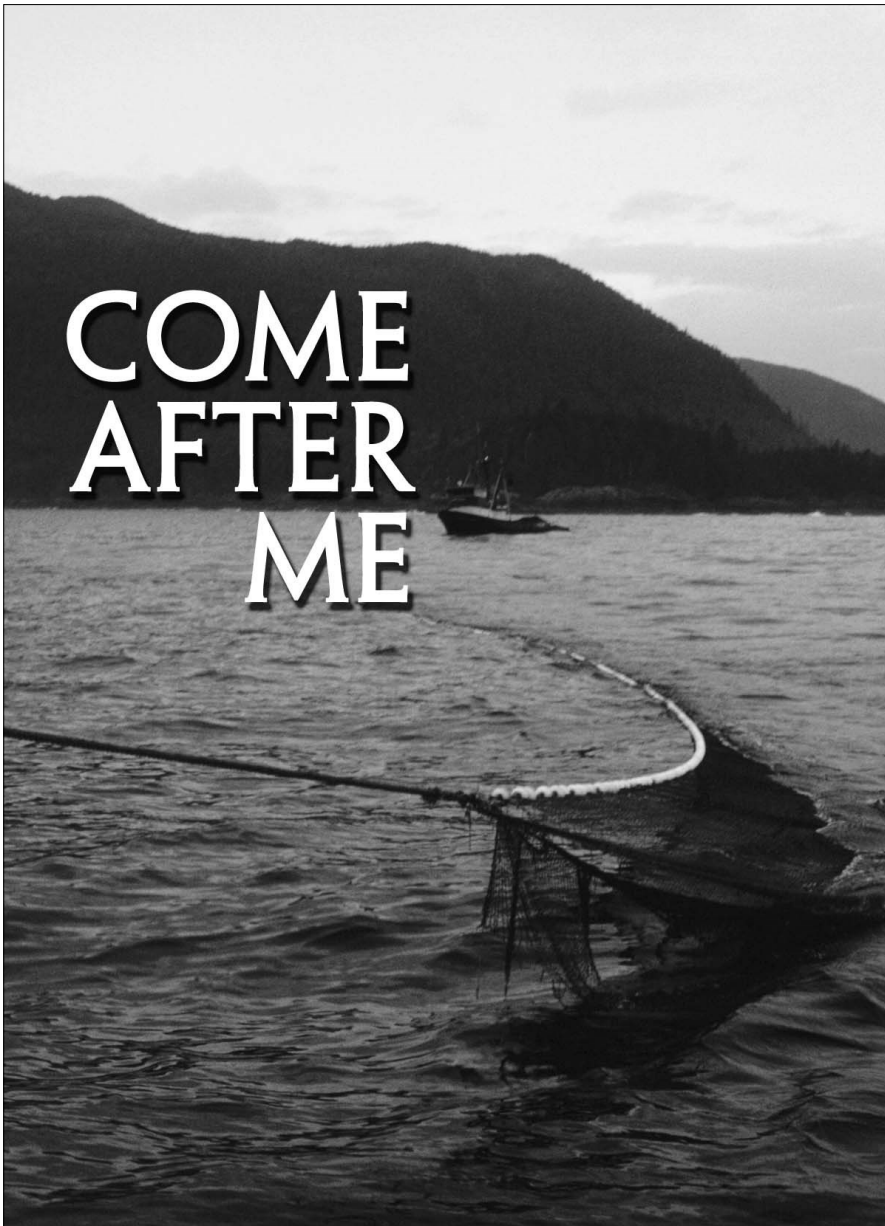

A letter from Fr. Dillon

Dear Parishioners,

The month of January has been flying by and before we get any further along into the year, I wanted to take an opportunity to express some words of gratitude.

At the Christmas Masses, I acknowledged those who had put so much effort into preparing for the Feast of the Lord's Nativity and it is appropriate to recognize them here, as well. Prior to Christmas, I had mentioned that we all needed to celebrate as normally as possible, even though we faced the challenges of the pandemic. Those who decorated the church did such a fantastic job in their efforts that what we saw on Christmas far exceeded what we could have hoped for. The arrangement of the poinsettias and placement of the Crèches really "popped" in a way that immediately caught the eye and drew people into the beauty that was before us.

Our Music Ministry, once again, added so much to the celebration of Jesus' birth. Although our choirs were small in number, they more than made up for it with their marvelous singing. I enjoy having the full choir at Mass, but having small choirs allowed us to enjoy the indi-

vidual talents that are present in our Music Ministry. One thing I truly missed, and I know many of you felt the same way, was being able to sing the Christmas hymns. I was feeling a bit down about that, but I found that just listening to them moved me in a new way. With that said, I still look forward to when it will be permitted to sing at Mass once again.

I want to express my profound gratitude for all those who made our 2020 Annual Collection a huge success. In the last three years of the appeal, each amounted to somewhere between \$19,000 - \$25,000. At the end of 2020, \$50,580 was pledged by 258 households. Thank you, thank you, thank you, for being so generous and supportive to this collection which is so important to the financial well-being and stability of the parish.

Finally, a word of great appreciation to the entire parish community. You continue to inspire me with the spirit that you possess. I am confident that because of you, once we are out of this pandemic, we will go into the future with new vigor and enthusiasm, and I greatly look forward to that day.

# Hearing God's Call

Life is a continuous series of choices from the moment we are born. Decisions are made every moment and every day of our lives. When we awake in the morning, we choose our breakfast, the clothes we wear and whether we smile or frown at the first people we will meet.

As young adults our decisions become more serious; the friends with whom we associate, the decision to follow the crowd or to follow a different path. Maturity and experience have a way of enlightening us and good and bad experiences help us in those decisions. Even our past bad experiences seem helpful when we become fully aware of the consequences. However, sometimes we repeat our mistakes and it takes us time to learn from them.

In our first reading, Jonah is called by God to tell the people of Nineveh of His anger with them and their impending destruction. Jonah tries to run away from God's request and winds up in the belly of a whale for three days. Expecting to be destroyed and die, Jonah prepares for his death only to be cast onto the shore by the whale and given a second chance. Jonah, not wanting to disobey God a second time, tells the people of their imminent destruction. Surprisingly, they listen to Jonah's message and return to God. However, Jonah becomes angry after God

sparing the people of Nineveh. He did not initially understand God's mercy and love even after he himself was spared from death by God.

Our gospel from Mark is in sharp contrast to the story of Jonah. Simon, Andrew, James and John (the sons of Zebedee), are called by God. The call is met with an immediate reply of acceptance. James and John did not even complete their day's work, but left their father along with his workers to finish what they had started. Unlike Jonah, they did not attempt to ignore God's call or run away. Many times during our lifetime God is calling us for something. Many times, we have either not heard the call, ignored it or just avoided doing as God asked.

God is very understanding of our failure to respond to him. He is patient and knows that we are often too preoccupied to hear His invitations. His mercy and forgiveness are without end. When we do listen, His celebrates our obedience. God does not give up on us but is always ready to respond to our accepting His call. God is loving but persistent no matter how hard we try to ignore him.

Sometimes, when we fail to respond, there will be consequences that we do not like. But in all cases, God always finds a way to continue to show his mercy. Through the waters of Baptism we are all called to be "fishers of men." As Peter, Andrew, James and John and the others proclaimed Jesus's message, we are called to do the same.

## Extension of Dispensation from Sunday Mass Obligation

*Now through Feb. 16, 2021*

Each and every Catholic in the Archdiocese of Hartford has been dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass by Archbishop Leonard P. Blair due to the potential danger of the coronavirus pandemic. In light of continued uncertainty regarding the extent and duration of the pandemic in the state of Connecticut, Archbishop Blair has now extended this dispensation from the Sunday obligation through Saturday, February 16, 2021.

The Archdiocese of Hartford continues to monitor the severity of the situation and will provide updates regarding decisions reached for the archdiocese as they are made.

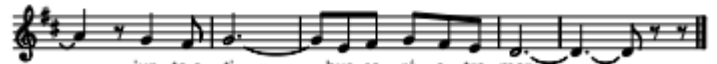

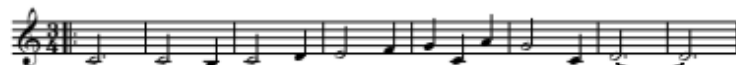

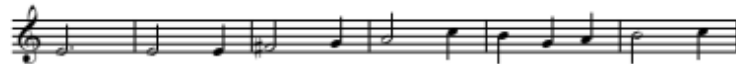
