

A letter from Fr. Dillon

Dear Parishioners,

On April 10-11, Boy Scout Jon Gorman carried out his Eagle Scout project which included work done here at Our Lady of Victory. He painted the parish hall entrance area and the hallway that leads to the restrooms. He also cleaned out and installed shelving in the storage room next to the stage. The entrance needed a “refresh” and the new paint certainly accomplished this. (One day we’ll have events in the hall again and you will be able to see this.) One thing we need of here is storage space; to have the storage closet next to the stage cleaned out and organized is something that is of great benefit to us. I genuinely appreciate the initiative, planning and hard work that Jon put into his project and congratulate him on a job well done.

You may have noticed, as you arrived for Mass last weekend, that almost all the shrubbery on the first island in the parking lot has been removed. I know when I exited the parking lot, I found it very difficult to see if any vehicles were approaching from the side. Also, with the pedes-

Last Saturday, a woman brought her mother, by wheelchair, from Surf Side to admire it and they too took photos with the tree in the background.

I know that our parish volunteer gardeners are eager to begin work on the various areas that they tend on our grounds. Last year, everything looked so nice and added so much to the beauty of our surroundings. This year, I’m sure we’ll see more of the same. I’ve also let our gardeners know that once the Easter flowers are “done,” they may have the bulbs to plant on our grounds. Spring is springing up all around us!

Meeting Jesus Again

Our readings this weekend continue the reactions of the disciples to Jesus' appearances at different times after His crucifixion. The emphasis by Jesus in these encounters is that He, prior to death, repeatedly spoke of what was to happen. Jesus again reminds His followers how it all was written in the Old Testament and was foretold by the early prophets. It is still unfathomable to His followers that Jesus is in their midst speaking and eating with them. In their disbelief, both after His resurrection and before His crucifixion, the disciples are unprepared in how to deal with Jesus and His words.

The first reading from Acts and the Gospel come from St. Luke and they complement each other, providing us with evidence of the disciples' encounters with Jesus. They show the power of the Holy Spirit filling St. Peter and the others with the knowledge, wisdom and courage to proclaim Christ Risen to the people.


Our Gospel comes on the heels of Jesus' meeting two of His disciples on the Road to Emmaus. These disciples tell how Jesus told them everything that happened and then, while breaking bread, revealed the words spoken at the Last Supper: the bread and the wine being His Body and blood. Still, many of them were doubtful and unbelieving. It is at this point that Jesus appears again and "they thought they were seeing a ghost." (Lk 24: 37) Jesus invites them to touch His hands and feet. He questions their disbelief and then, to still prove His appearance, asks them for something to eat and consumes it. At this point, Jesus reminds them that He told them all this would happen beforehand; that it was written in the Law of Moses, the prophets and the psalms.

Our first reading demonstrates the power of the Holy Spirit and Jesus' command to spread the Good News. St. Peter holds nothing back. He, who once denied knowledge of Jesus and was filled with doubt and skepticism, is now proclaiming the Risen Christ and repeating to the people what Christ said to them. Those who once denied and fled from the possibility of their own

arrest and death, are now witnessing to Christ. They have become witnesses to the Gospel and begin through the power of the Holy Spirit to bring the message to many people.

We, as descendants of St. Peter through the sacrament of Baptism and filled with the Holy Spirit, are also called to proclaim the Risen Christ. St. John, in our second reading, sums it up by saying we can only love God by keeping His commandments, that is, by loving our neighbors and sharing the GOOD News of love and mercy.






