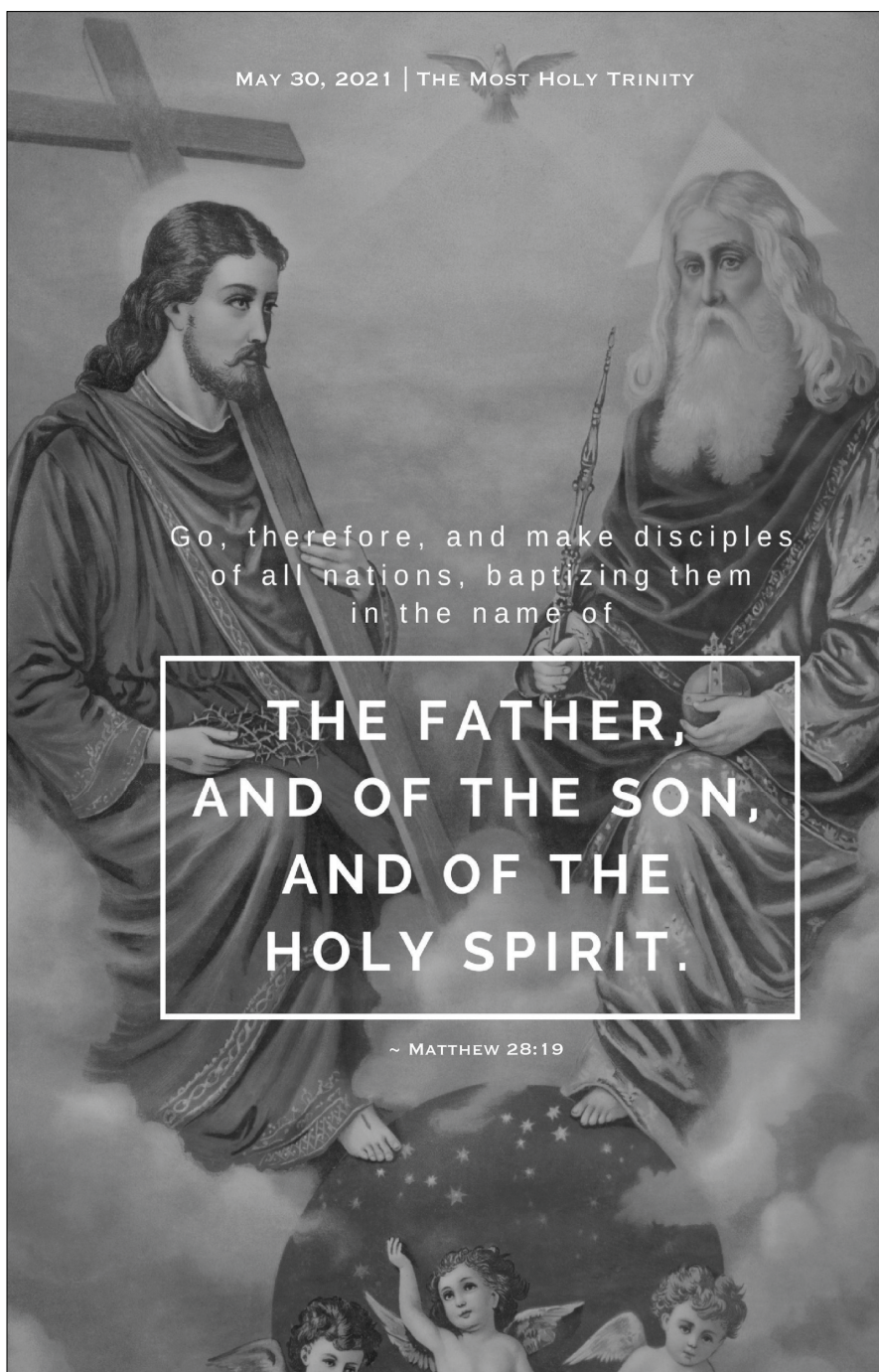

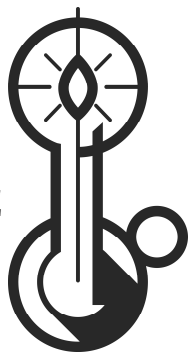

Share Jesus' Message, Not Gossip

A letter from Fr. Dillon



Dear Parishioners.

A quick recap: Last weekend I announced that Fr. Robert Landback has been appointed Administrator of our Parish, effective July 1, 2021. For those wondering, it is not uncommon for a priest to be appointed Administrator. He has all the same responsibilities and duties as a Pastor. I was an Administrator for one year before being named Pastor in my last assignment.

Last weekend, I discovered that the rumor mill is running rampant and I will not mention what I heard. However, I always find it amazing that some people will speak with "authority" regarding the future of the parish or other matters and are eager to share what they "know" to be "true." What I heard was something totally new to me and wondered why I wasn't informed of it first.

Every time I hear that the rumor mill is churning at full capacity, I wonder what the church would look like if those who are spreading false information put their energies and enthusiasm into spreading the Truth of the Gospel. Where would the church or parish be today if people spoke about Jesus as readily as they share gossip? Quite possibly, we would be in a differ-

ent situation than the

one we now face. If more people would share their faith as freely as they share rumors, there might be more people in the pews or more vocations to the priesthood, religious life and diaconate. If the faith and the Truth of Jesus were to be shared with the same enthusiasm as the falsehood found in rumor and gossip, more souls might be brought to Christ.

Our enthusiasm for our faith is always something that is contagious. People are drawn to others who are enthusiastic and joyful in their faith; others want to know why we are like this and they want it for themselves. As you can tell, I hate rumor and gossip and I hope that all of us hate it, too, and will not engage in it; all it does is cause confusion and anxiety in others and none of us ought to be agents of that.

On a brighter note (in more ways than one!), I want to express my thanks to Rob Vets and his sons, Robbie and Tommy, for taking down the pine tree in the courtyard. The pine was leaning on the covered walk, only had needles on one side of it, and it needed to go. Thanks to the Vets for a great job.

The Most Holy Trinity

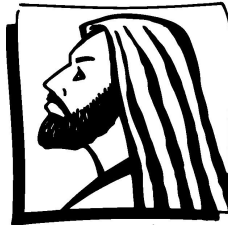
If we consider that God is present in our lives at all times, we can understand the meaning of the Trinity more clearly. God is omnipresent” (widely or constantly encountered). There is no facet of our life in which He is not present. He knows our waking and our sleeping. (Ps 139) If we are truly His children, and we are, our Heavenly Father will do everything possible to help us find our way to Him.

Our God is a God of love and justice. Since His creation of the first humans, He desired that we return that love for creating us. Since the story of Adam and Eve, He has continually shown Himself in varied ways. (Heb 1:1) Through the lives of Moses and Abraham, God was present to His children and provided them with guidance and love to right the injustices of other humans. He established a Covenant with His children, promising never to abandon them and to teach them ways of love and kindness to each other.

Even when His children strayed from returning His love and found comfort in other gods, our Heavenly Father continued to show mercy and forgiveness. He gave us the Prophets to forewarn us of impending dangers and even then, His children strayed from Him. Yet, God did not abandon His children.

He gave us a human example of Himself in His Son, Jesus, and showed us perfection in being human. He demonstrated how to treat others and to love Him at the same time. Through Jesus, He taught that all people were His children, the good and the bad. There was no distinction for gender, race, religion or economic status; all were equal.

Yet the injustices of humans continued; persecution, ridicule, betrayal and abandonment by the friends and followers Jesus. His teachings and example showed us, as God’s only begotten Son, He was “the way, the truth and the



light.” (Jn14:6) He told His followers to be obedient to the will of the Father, just as He was obedient. Jesus promised us Eternal Life for our obedience and proved that in His own crucifixion and resurrection.

In preparing His disciples for His imminent death, resurrection and ascension into heaven, Jesus promised again that God would not abandon us. The Resurrected Jesus tells us, “I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever.” (Jn 14:16) God’s continual love has never left us alone.

The Holy Trinity provides us with God’s never-ending love. Through all creation, He has given us every opportunity to know of His love for us and how we are to return that love. God is our creator; Jesus is our sanctifier and redeemer; and the Holy Spirit guides us in our life to straighten the crooked paths that will lead us back to God for Eternity.

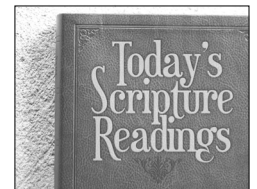

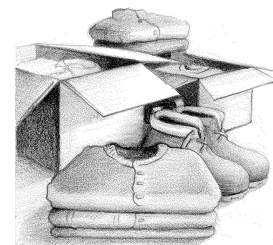

June 21-July 9

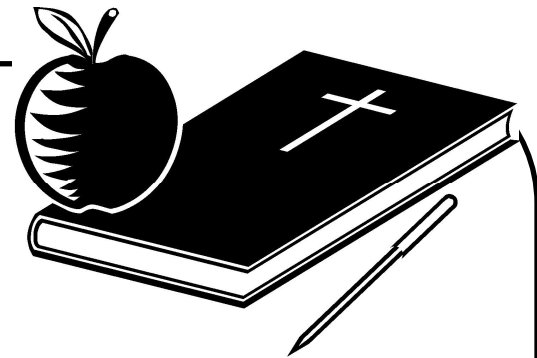
