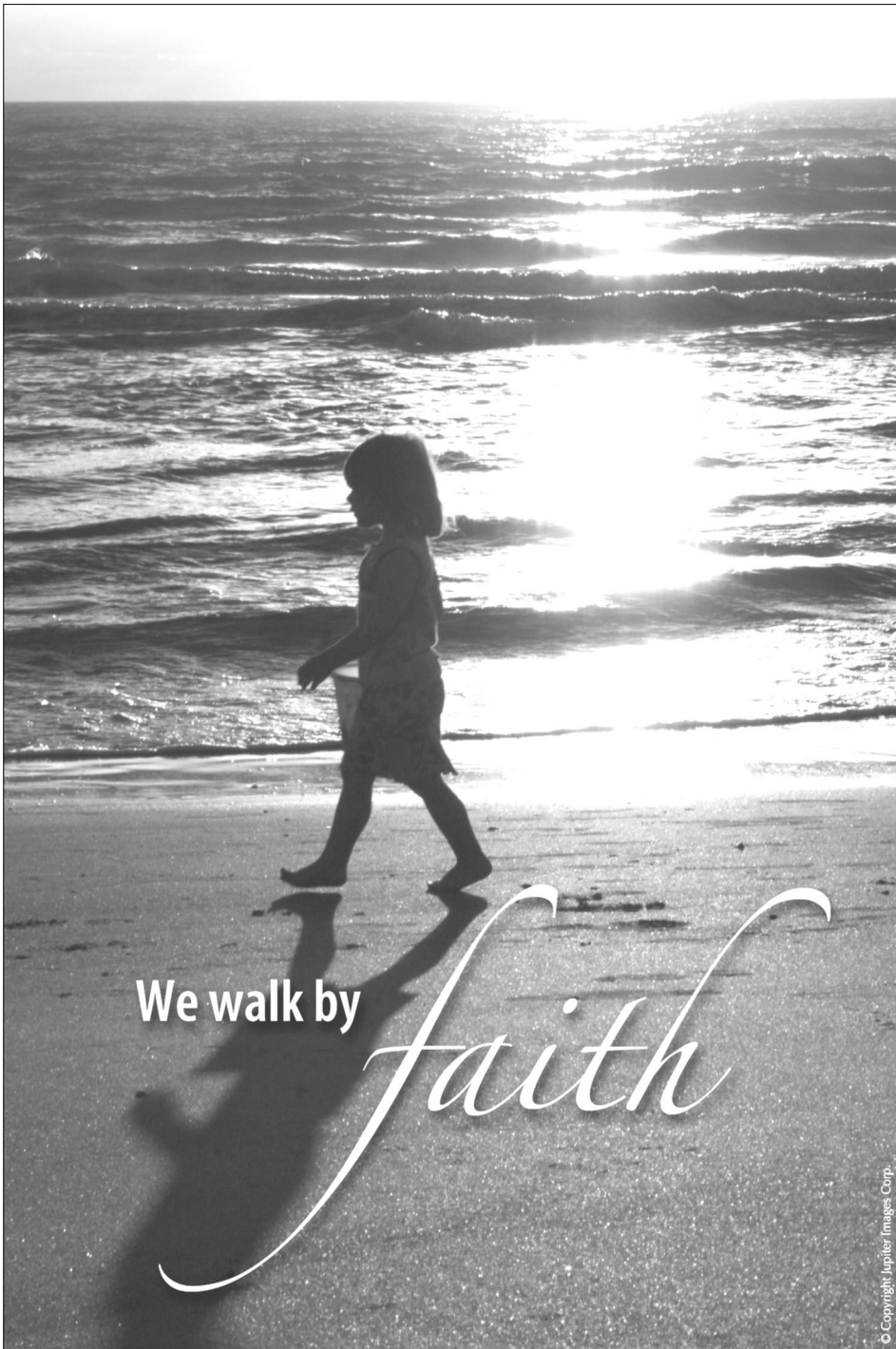

Fewer Masks, More Worshippers!

A letter from Fr. Dillon

Dear Parishioners,

The day that many have been waiting for has finally arrived: masks are no longer required to be worn in church by those who are fully vaccinated. As I mentioned last week, those who have not completed their vaccination regimen and the unvaccinated are still required to wear a mask. I also mentioned that we are relying on the honesty of everyone to follow the guideline which applies to them as well as their concern for the health and well-being of their fellow parishioners.

Along those lines, it is important for you to know, that those who are distributing Holy Communion are still required to wear a mask. Lastly, I had spoken many times about having a “mask burning celebration.” I would like to incorporate this as part of the ice-cream social taking place on Sunday, June, 27 at 2 PM. Let’s pray for good weather but if it does rain, it won’t deter us from this long-awaited moment.

I’m glad to see that attendance at Mass is slowly increasing; last weekend the 4:30 PM Mass had about 150 people while the three Sunday Masses each had about 125 people. I hope that more people will feel comfortable in joining

us in worship; I know

that I miss seeing those who haven’t been here since the shutdown last year and their fellow parishioners miss them too.

Recently, Fr. Landback came by to meet with me and to talk about the parish and see the buildings and grounds. When we entered the church, I felt like giving him an umbrella and saying “welcome to your new parish.” I explained what has been happening and that we have, as a top priority, been trying to resolve this problem. One of the things that we are concerned about is the location of the water drains which lie between the roof and church ceiling. After running water through the drains for at least 15 minutes, there were no leaks. With the recent dry weather, the roofers can come and look at the roof more closely. I really want this resolved by the time Fr. Landback arrives; at least he knows what happening. I will say that he took it all in good stride!

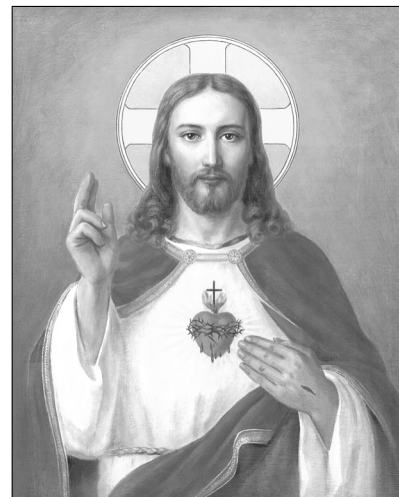

Painting Pictures for Us

As we return to Ordinary time on the Church calendar, we leave behind — for the present — the many sacred holy days and feasts. These past three weekends have focused on God’s presence in our lives helping us through the ordinary routines that we encounter daily. In celebrating these special feasts, we are reminded to live out the gospel of His son. Through the gifts of the Holy Spirit, God continues to be present as He promised His disciples. He has left us with nourishment for the soul in the Eucharist. With these holy-days and gifts, we are called to bear much fruit with what God has left us.

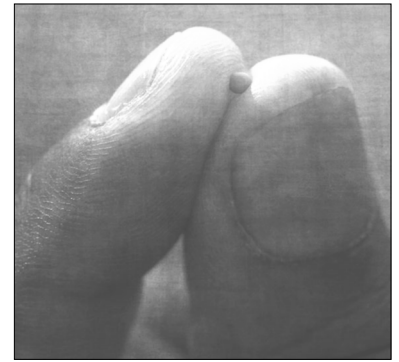
St. Paul, in our reading from 2 Corinthians, reminds us that it takes courage to live our life. It is in faith that we live out each day. We cannot see the future but must rely on God’s guiding hand to get us through everything. Even those who long to be with the Lord in Heaven seek His help here on Earth. The aim for those that love Him is to please Him in everything we do. Ultimately, it is God who judges our actions.

Our first reading is from the prophet Ezekiel. God tells us through the prophet that it is He who is the creator of all things. *He is the Lord of all* and it is He who provides us with trees and plants that bear fruit to sustain us. It is He who can “make a withered tree bloom,” “brings low the high tree” and “brings high the low tree.”

As with all the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke), Jesus continues to teach His followers through parables and examples to which we can relate. He tells us what the Kingdom of God should be about; what God is asking of us, as we live out our life. He cites the story of the mustard seed. The “smallest of all seeds” but once sown, puts forth the largest of plants; enough to provide shade for the birds of the sky. Jesus’ parables paint visual pictures for us so we can understand the full meaning of these stories.

Our readings this weekend help us to understand life’s meaning more clearly in relation to what God has done for us. Fully acknowledg-

ing that God is the source of everything, we, as His instruments created in His image and likeness, are called to be co-creators of His Kingdom. The smallest of our good deeds can bear much fruit. We are called to have faith that God, through us, can do good things in service to others.



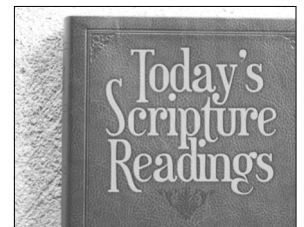

Reporting an Incident of Sexual Abuse to the Archdiocese

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the **Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults**. This document is also available online at www.archdioceseofhartford.org. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulner-

able adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Incidents involving sexual abuse of minors (persons under the age of 18) should be reported to:

Incidents involving sexual abuse of vulnerable adults aged 18–59 should be reported to:

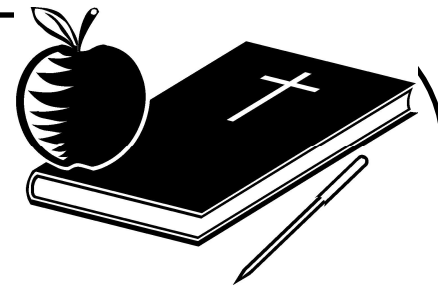

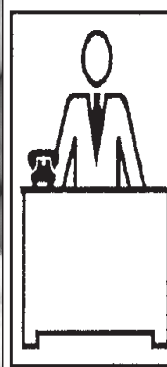
