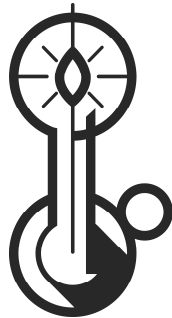

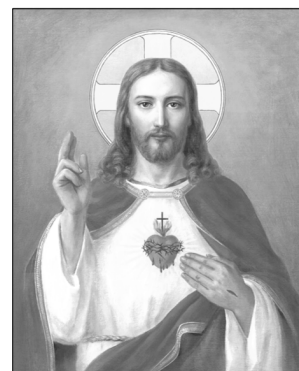

Faith and Trust

Many of us will remember a childhood game where we were taught to trust others. We were asked to stand with our backs to a group of other children, told to close our eyes, and fall backwards into the waiting arms of the group who would protect us from falling and hurting ourselves.

It is not as easy as it seems. To have faith that others have our best interests at heart does take courage. However, if you really think about the idea of trusting others, we do it nearly every waking moment of the day. How about when driving your car and one approaches from the opposite direction? You trust that the other car will not cross over into your lane and hit your car. How about when we buy food in a store or eat in a restaurant? Do we not trust that the food is fresh and safe?

As a young man traveling for business alone, I always worried that if the plane crashed, my wife and daughters would be left alone and my wife would have a difficult time raising my them and getting them through school. I can smile now because after a while, I realized that nobody else on that plane, including the crew and the pilot, wanted to die either.

Yes, we live most of our lives having faith that others will do what they say they will do. Obviously, we live in a world in which that is not always true. Faith does not only apply to our belief in God and the Trinity, but an everyday occurrence where we trust family, friends and people we may never meet personally.

Our Gospel this weekend causes us to reflect on the words of Jesus. Fear sometimes consumes us primarily because we lack any experience in trusting others in specific situations. But fear can be overcome by *trying* to trust others. Soon, we experience some confidence that what we fear is either unfounded or not logical. The woman who approached Jesus today trusted that Jesus would heal her. Even in her difficulty to speak with Him, she trusted that just touching His cloak would be the remedy for her illness. Jesus used His miracles to emphasize that people need to have faith in God. Remember Peter trying to walk on water? He was able to do so as long as his faith carried him. Once doubt entered, he began to sink.

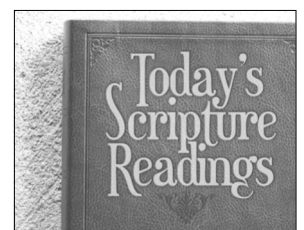
Where does our faith in God lie? Does it need to be strengthened? How do we do that? Prayer will ultimately strengthen our experience with God. Constant prayer, where God is first and foremost in our lives, allows God to get us through our difficulties and challenges. As with the trust we place in family and friends, it is through our experience with God in prayer that we can trust and have faith He is there with us in all our afflictions.

Heavenly Father, pour out Your grace on Fr. Dillon and all priests.

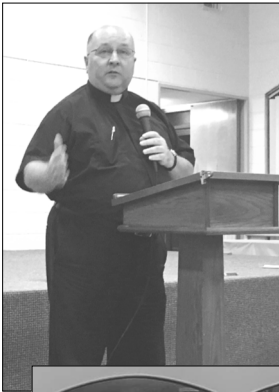
Let him remember that in serving your people, he is never alone.
