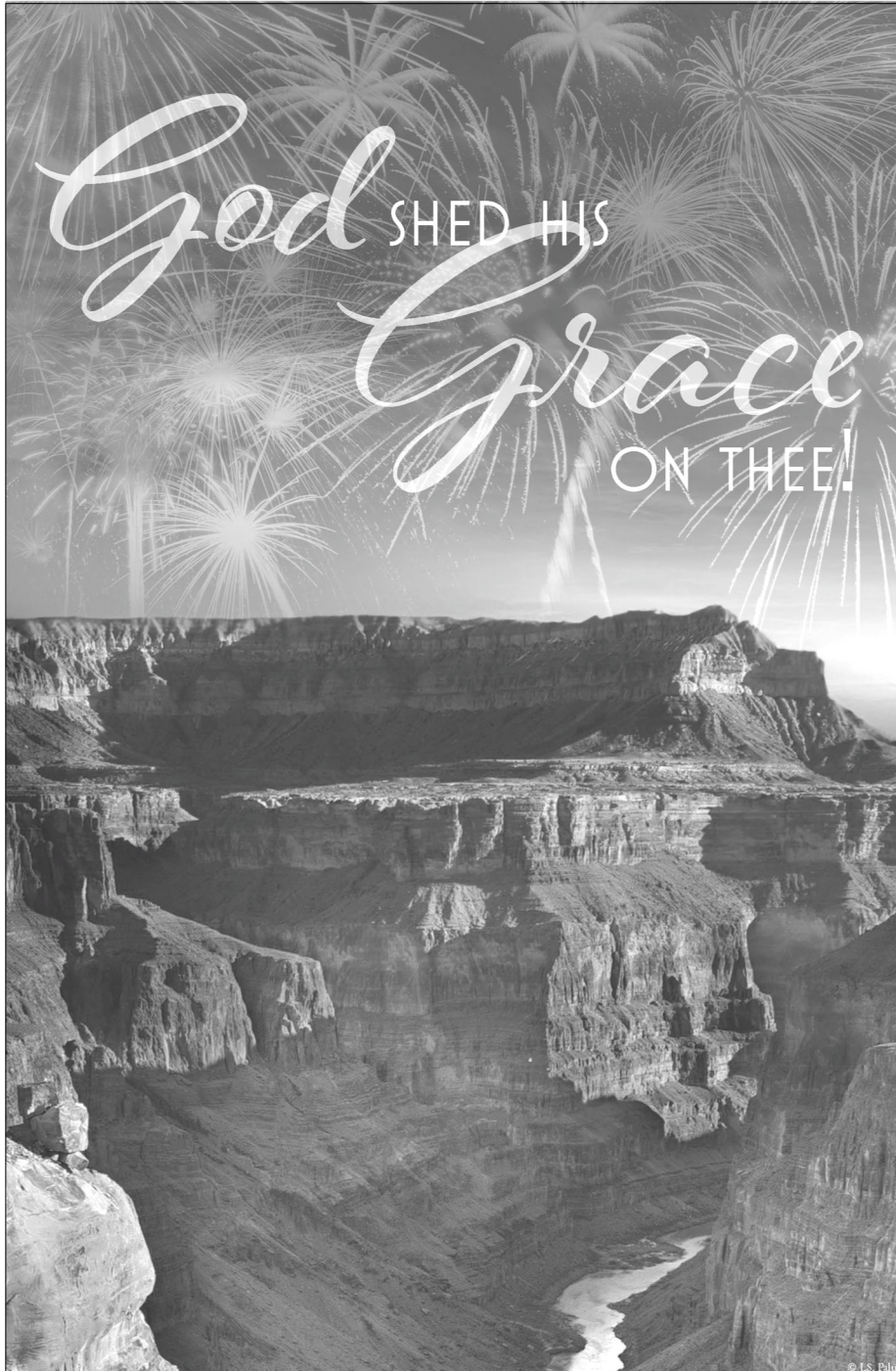

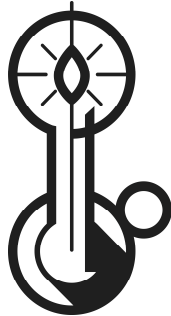

# Let Me Introduce Myself...

*A Note from Fr. Landbeck*

With this Sunday, I begin to serve as your Parish Administrator. Today, I join you in the journey you have already been making as members of Our Lady of Victory Parish. I look forward to learning more about your journey and getting acquainted with you individually.

Let me share with you a bit about myself. I was raised in the Episcopal Church. After college, I worked as a teacher and then in 1980 entered what was then the new field of "information technology." Sally and I married in 1984 and were blessed to have four children (three sons and one daughter).

At age 40, I entered seminary in the Episcopal Church and after ordination, I served Episcopal parishes in California, Texas, and Connecticut. During those years of ministry, however, we gradually sensed a call by God to the Catholic Faith. Finally, in 2005, we were received into the Catholic Church.

I returned to "secular" employment but five years later was accepted into a special priestly formation process for former Episcopal clergy. In 2011, I was ordained to the transitional diaconate and in 2012 to the priesthood of the Catholic Church. I served 4 years as assistant at St. Mary's in Branford and most recently 5 years as pastor



of Our Lady of Fatima in Wallingford. I have also served as Courage Chaplain for the Archdiocese for the last seven years.

We have lived in our home in New Haven since 2007. Sally has a legal practice, serving small business clients.

What I enjoy most about ministering as a priest is proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ and celebrating the Sacraments of the Church through which we can receive Him into our lives. I will strive, with God's help, to provide prayerful leadership to the parish.

# Courage in Faith

Many people experience adverse reactions from others when they assume a role different from that which they are known. When that role is one of leadership on civic or corporate matters, a person's family and/or personal background may be used to form other's opinions about him/her. People tend to question the authenticity of the person's truthfulness and often accuse that person of using his/her position as an opportunity to advance their success or power.

Our readings this weekend focus on the reaction of friends to those who openly profess their faith in God. The other theme looks at the difficulties that people in public roles experience. Many experience personal challenges, the same as me and you. Oftentimes, people are placed in roles for which they feel ill-prepared, but feel obligated to honor the commitment.

Our first reading this week is from the prophet Ezekiel who is called by God to proclaim salvation for the Jewish people, even though he is not from the land of Israel. God called him to warn the Jewish people of the imminent threat of the destruction of Jerusalem. Ezekiel is called to testify for God but encounters significant criti-

cism. His message is to warn the people of the need to change their hearts into one of love and concern for others.

St. Paul in our second reading takes a more personal tone. Paul explains that even in his execution of God's call to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus, he suffers from many of the temptations and agonies of the people to whom he is called to preach. He speaks to a more specific unnamed "thorn in the flesh." His obedience to God's call continues in spite of the fact that this "thorn" continues even after his pleading to God to remove it. Paul recognizes his responsibility to God and remains obedient. He understands that God's grace will get him through these temptations and he remains true to God.

Not unlike the prophets that went before him, Jesus suffers the same fate. He is misunderstood by people who know his family background and upbringing. There is little He can say in proclaiming God's message to convince them otherwise. As He speaks in the synagogues, He is dismissed as unknowing and belittled because of His humble beginnings.

The call to profess faith in God and to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ is not always an easy task. Whether one is called to public ministry or to proclaim Jesus' words to family and friends, people can be vulnerable to criticism and ridicule. We can take some comfort in the experience of the saints before us: living the life of a Christian takes courage and a strong faith that God will see us through our mission here in life.

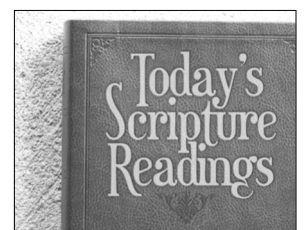

**Gospel** — "Where did this man get all this? Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary?" (Mark 6:1-6a).



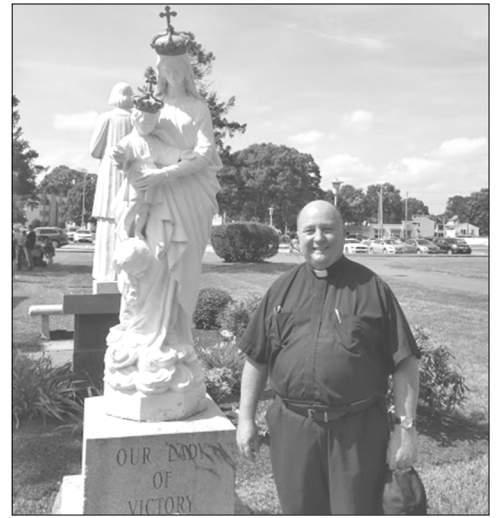
# Goodbye, Best Wishes and Thank You to Fr. Dillon

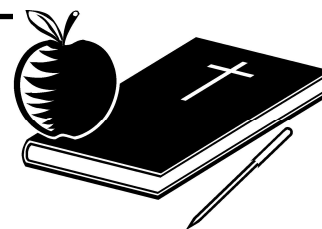


