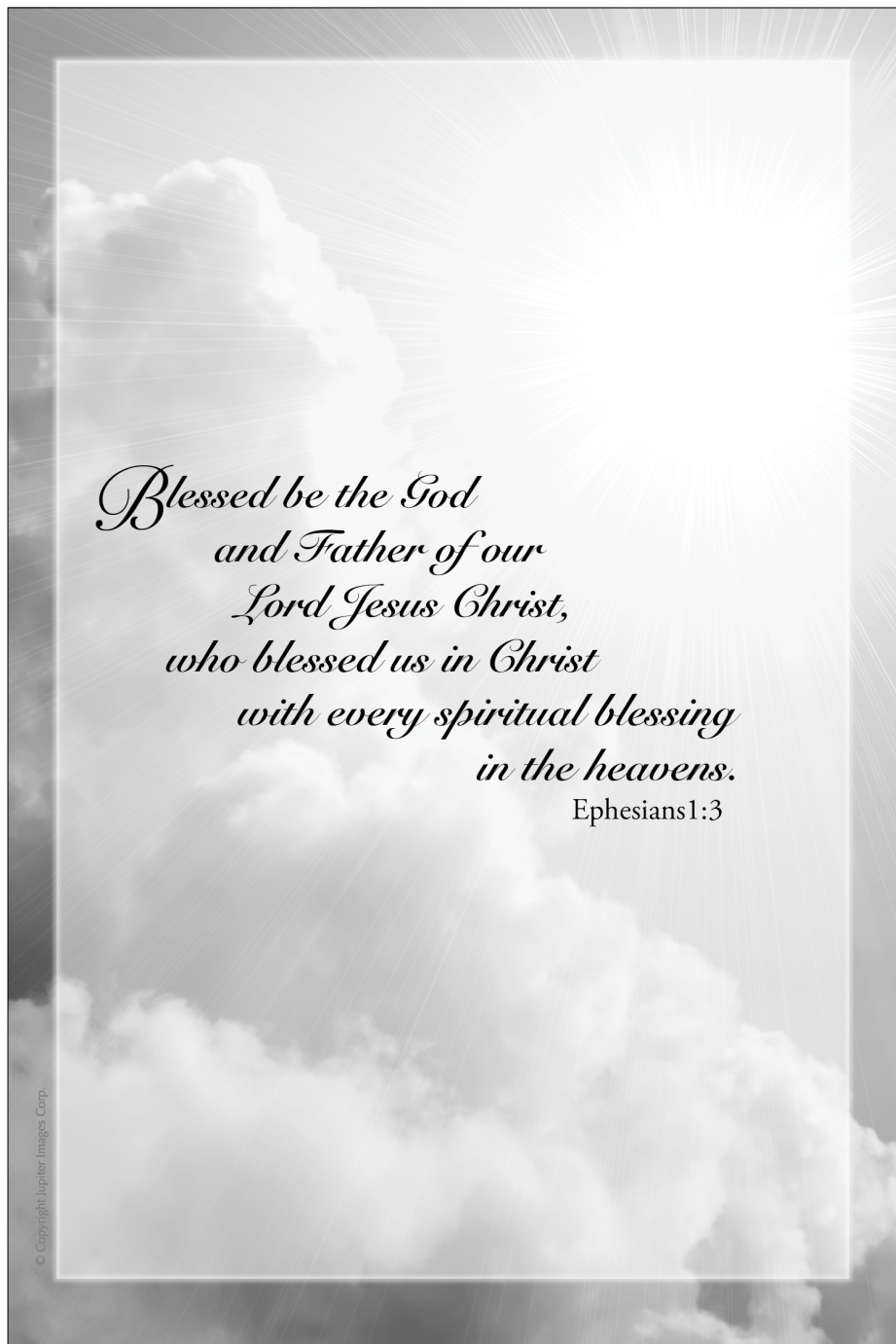

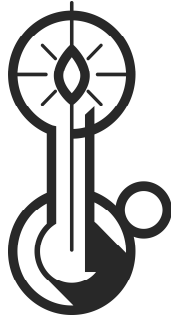

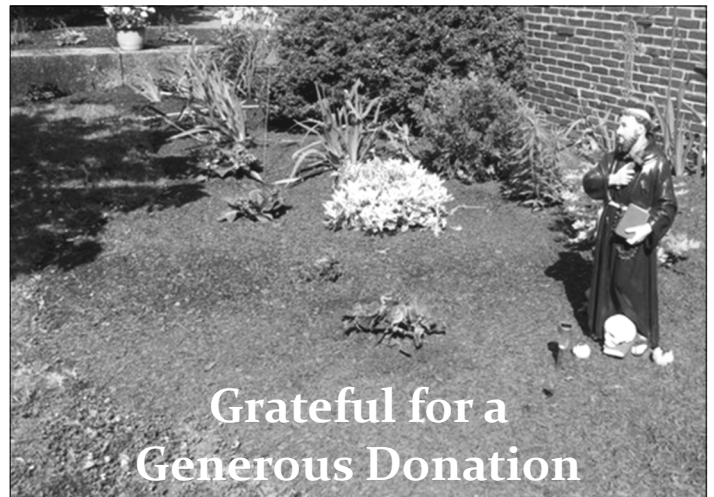

Getting the Message Out

Lately, television seems to be continuous commercial advertisements interspersed with some form of entertainment or news. Over the years, we have seen many ads promoting products that tell us the benefits of using a particular item; citing its comfort or curing advantages. All of this is done with smiling faces, letting the viewer know that this spokesperson is happy they are using this product.

We are a captive audience to the commercials. Letting people know of your product or service is essential to the success of a business. However, profitability is only part of the story. Essential medical and social services must be promoted so that people can become aware of them. In fact, in our busy lives, the message of commercial advertisers and essential health services needs to be repeated many times before it registers in our minds.

Our readings focus on the need to advertise God's presence in the world. Amos is called by God to proclaim His promise to the people of Bethel. However, his words are rejected by those in authority and he moves on to another place. Amos rebukes the criticism of the authorities by

stating he is a simple shepherd called by God not as a "prophet," but simply as one asked by God to proclaim His presence.

As we are aware, Jesus' disciples were not the elite of his region but ordinary residents. They were fishermen, tax collectors and common laborers called to learn of God through the teachings and example of Jesus. In our Gospel, Jesus now sends these ordinary people out to proclaim God's message of love and kindness; lighting the way for the Kingdom of God. Like Amos, they are common people with little resources and Jesus tells them not to quit when they are rejected but to move on and continue their mission.

Much of our life is focused on the things that help us obtain security of family, friendship and peace of mind. More and more, we seem to feel that God is absent in this world. However, God's presence in our life is indisputable. We need to find time through prayer, reflection and public worship to be reminded that only through God's gift of life and the sacrifice of His Son can we live in the hope and promise of Eternal Life.

Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, we are called to proclaim the Good News and promote the message of the Gospel. As with Amos and Jesus' disciples, our examples of charity and kindness to each other will get the message out of God's presence in the world. Isaiah 43:1 tells us: "Do not be afraid—I will save you. I have called you by name—you are mine."

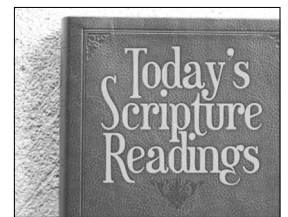

Learning About the Mass:
The Eucharistic Prayer

After the presider washes his hands, he turns to the people and says, “Pray that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.” We have brought forward bread and wine, and are now asked to see in these gifts upon the altar a sacrifice offered to God. Our response is rich in theological meaning. “May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands.”

The words point to the unique role of the priest, whose hands, at his ordination, were anointed for just this purpose: that he might “sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God” (*Rite of Ordination*). We ask God to accept our sacrifice “for the praise and glory of his name.” And God, never to be outdone in generosity, gives all that we have given back to us, “for our good and the good of all his Church.” This Mass benefits not just those who have gathered, but, in the mysterious economy of grace, the whole Church.

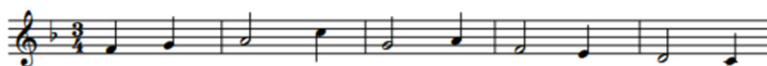

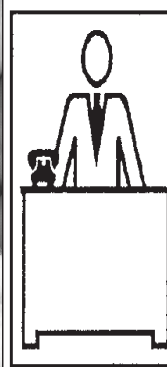
