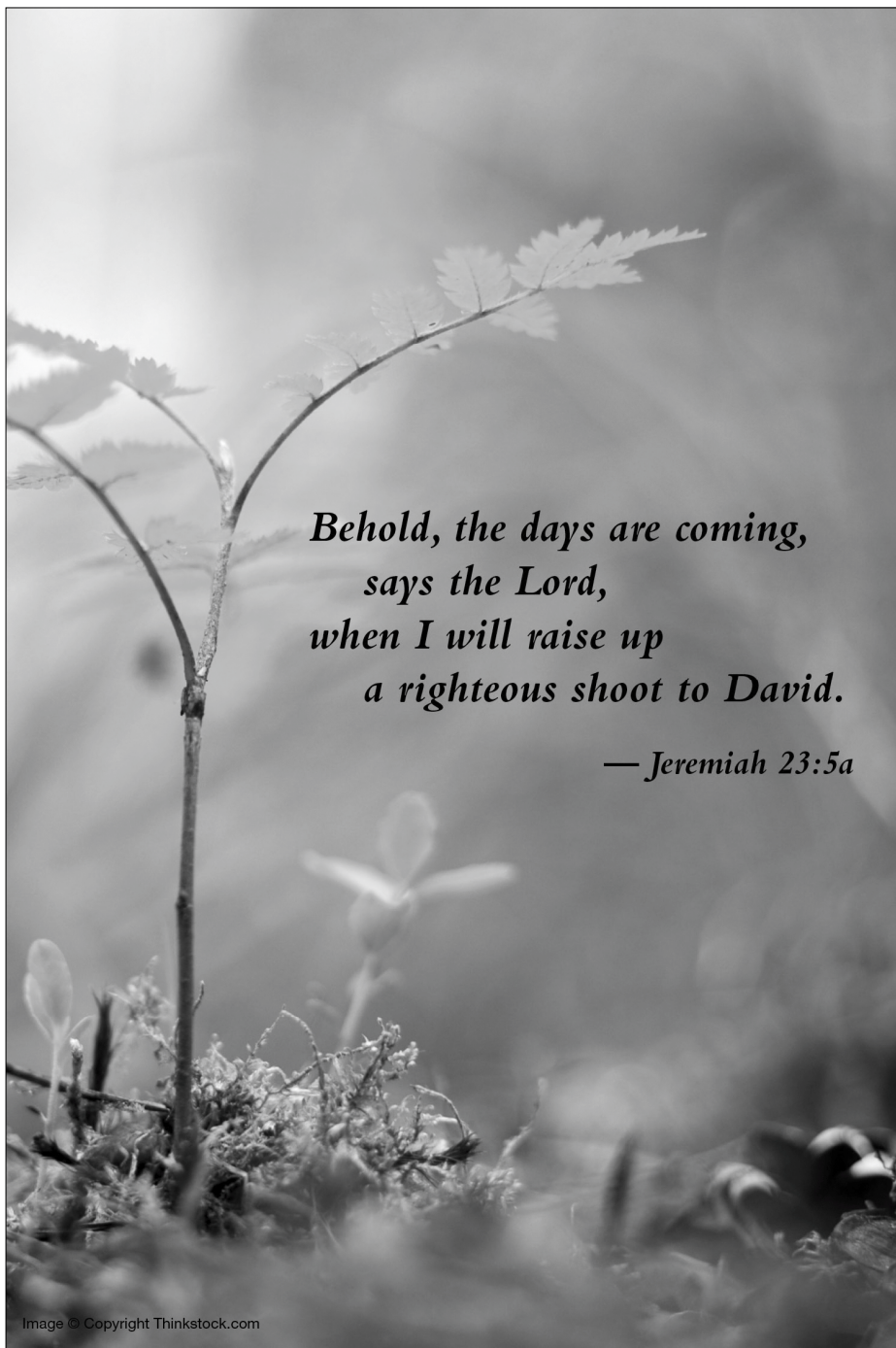

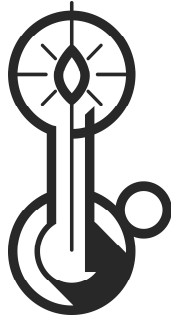

Leadership

Over the many years I spent in corporate work, one thing I learned is that everybody reports to somebody above them. Years ago, when working for a large company, we were involved in the acquisition of another company. Many months of meetings went into planning and management people from both companies shuttled back and forth to determine how we would combine.

Everything was humming along well until one Monday morning when the news reported that a third-party was now offering cash for the same company we wished to acquire. Obviously, the shareholders welcomed the cash offer as opposed to the stock offer in our company in which they had little knowledge. Within months of the failed acquisition, the CEO was removed and a more aggressive one was elected.

All of us, no matter what our role, have to answer to someone for our actions. While we all have ideas of how things should work, we still have a responsibility to follow the dictates of someone who might have different ideas. Our country and church all have fail-safe guidelines to ensure no one person can unilaterally control everything. There is always some mechanism for oversight.

Ultimately, we all answer to God for our actions. The first line of the reading from the Prophet Jeremiah sets the tone this weekend, "Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter ... says the Lord." This imagery of the shepherd is prominent in both Testaments and his primary responsibility is the care and safety of his flock. The reading sets the tone for a shepherd as a good leader; one who removes any fear people may have.

Our Gospel this weekend shows Jesus as a kindler, gentler leader. After Jesus sent out the disciples in last week's passage, we see Him now welcoming their return. He is conscious of the difficulty they have had; the rejection and ridi-

cule they suffered. He invites them to rest in an out of the way place to recover. Even in His concern for His disciples, He does not lose sight of the needs of the people who are following them. Jesus' obedience to the will of the Father never wavers. He knows His Father's call to teach all those He encounters; not only His band of followers, but those who have come to realize the special qualities of this man.



As Christians and followers of Christ, we follow Jesus' lead and obedience to the Father, guiding those away from evil into the light. We are all teachers and leaders of the truth. Whether we hold positions of leadership or not, the example of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is an example of care and selfless concern to drive away the fear and insecurity of others.

How sweet is the Shepherds sweet lot,
From the morn to the evening he strays:
He shall follow his sheep all the day
And his tongue shall be filled with praise.

For he hears the lambs innocent call,
And he hears the ewes tender reply,
He is watchful while they are in peace,
For they know when their Shepherd is nigh.

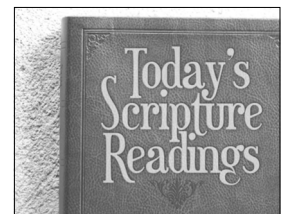

Serving through the Pandemic: Our Music Ministry

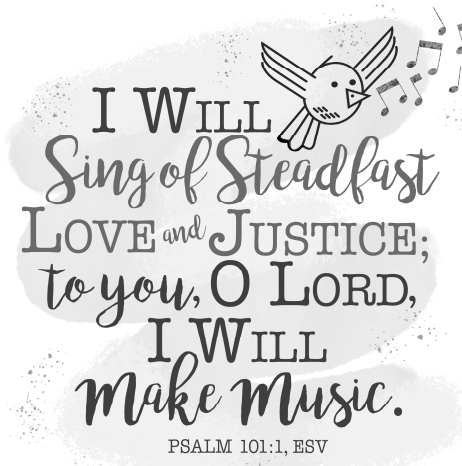
As we begin to emerge from this pandemic, we are taking the opportunity to thank those ministries that continued to serve throughout these many months. One exemplary example is our **Music Ministry**.

Even before congregations were allowed to return to Mass, Ed Perez, our music director, saw the importance of music to enhance the live-streamed liturgies. Since choir participation was initially not allowed due to COVID-19 restrictions, Ed prepared and performed the music solo at weekly liturgies, while wearing a mask and maintaining social distance. Eventually, individual cantors such as Jaci Chiarelli, Maggie McAndrew and Cherylanne Monck joined him. (Thank you!)

Due to the restrictions, group choir practice could not be held. Once small groups were allowed to perform together while wearing masks and maintaining social distance, Ed would record the songs and psalms and text them to the individuals scheduled to sing so they could practice and prepare each week. Each scheduled and rotating member would also receive a weekly email with specific instructions on how each and any song would be presented at Mass. An arduous task for all involved!

Each group was and is still broken down

into 4-6 members some of whom may live in the same household. They are socially distanced in the choir loft using individual microphones and stands.



These choir members have been diligent and gracious in sharing their time and talent to bring beautiful music to our liturgies. It has been a challenge to do this work independently; even learning new Mass parts and songs.

We truly thank those who have served during this pandemic, especially Ed. Maria Tangredi also enhanced so many liturgies with her delightful flute playing. We truly look forward to the day when the full choir can return!

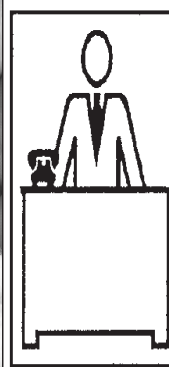
