A Note from Fr. Landback

Jesus takes His disciples on a journey to villages in the north, and on the way, asks what people are saying about who He is. The people, it seems, try to fit Jesus into the categories they know: John the Baptist or Elijah or one of the prophets. This would make Him easier for them to understand.

Jesus, however, wants to know what the disciples -- who have spent a lot of time with Him -- think. Peter speaks up, “You are the Messiah, the Christ,” (the Anointed One). This would place Jesus in an entirely different category. Alt-

hough, it is not clear that they knew exactly what it meant to be the Christ.

Jesus begins by explaining His future rejection by the elders, priests and religious leaders in Jerusalem. He will be brutally killed but will rise on the third day. Peter rebukes Jesus for because this is not what he had in mind! Jesus, in turn, rebukes Peter *and* Satan. He deals with Satan first, saying, “Get behind me.” With all of the authority of God, Jesus rebukes spiritual evil. But, to Peter, He simply says that Peter is not thinking God’s thoughts but man’s thoughts.

Peter seems to have been seeking a salvation that would be achieved without Jesus’ dying and rising again. God, however, has a salvation in mind that is both deeper and broader: the salvation of the human race from the power of evil by the imparting of a new spirit, the Spirit of God within man. The only means for that Spirit to be released into the human race would be Jesus’ sacrificial death on the Cross, thereby breaking the power of Satan over human souls through the mercy of God.

The Cost of Discipleship

One of the more famous books written during the rise of Hitler was by Dietrich Bonhoeffer and entitled the “*Cost of Discipleship*.” Bonhoeffer, a Lutheran Minister and German, emphasized the need for Christians to not only say they were Christian, but to live out their faith by acts of love and charity, even if it meant the sacrifice of one’s life.

Bonhoeffer lived during the time of Hitler’s reign in Germany and the extermination of millions of Jews. Opposed to many of the policies of the Nazi regime, he moved to New York City in the late 1930s to teach at the Union Theological Seminary. As Hitler’s conquest of Europe continued and his reign of terror cost the lives of millions of innocent civilians, he made the decision to return to Germany to support and become part of the resistance to remove Hitler from power. Many attempts to end Hitler’s reign failed, even as he watched his friends executed. He himself was finally arrested and executed, along with his brother, by the Nazis in April 1945, a short time before the end of the war.

Our readings this weekend focus on the issue of sacrifice and the need to demonstrate our faith with action. Our first reading from the Prophet Isaiah describes a servant of God enduring ridicule and criticism. The passage talks about someone who is beaten and humiliated but offers to God this suffering. They demonstrate their love for God by trusting that He will not abandon them in their time of need. It is in these acts that one is able to show his/her message of love. It is an act of faith acknowledging that God comforts and protects all His creatures.

Jesus, in our Gospel, takes the opportunity to tell His disciples what is in store for Him. He describes His obedience to the will of the Father and tells them of His passion and death; not only to prepare them for what is to come, but also what they may encounter as His followers. He

begins by asking the apostles, “Who do people say that I am?” Stating that Jesus is a great prophet, His disciples liken Him to Elijah and others who suffered for the love of God. It is Peter, however, who dismisses Jesus’ description of His own suffering. Jesus chastises Peter for his failure of faith because it seems Peter does not believe that God is in control of the world. Jesus instructs His followers that it is the obligation of *all* God’s followers to be obedient to the Father’s will.

He must suffer in this life as they, too, must also suffer. This demonstration in the face of adversity is a manifestation of true faith in God.

Our reading from St. James succinctly states that faith in God without trust and abandonment to His will is an empty faith. As people of faith, our sacrifices to help others demonstrate true faith in God.

Jesus’ life is a life of self-sacrifice for the needs of others. His life, death and resurrection are a complete abandonment to the will of the Father. Our profession of faith in God is only complete when it includes meeting the needs of others; even to the extent of sacrificing our own needs. As in the words of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, there is no “cheap grace.” The cost of discipleship is offering ourselves when called upon, for the needs of others.

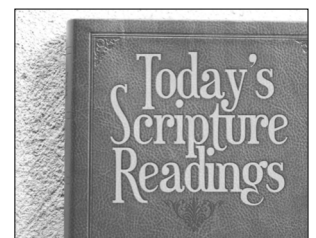

Haiti Relief Donations

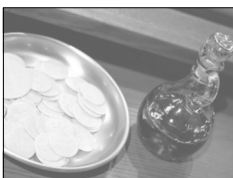
Donations are still being collected to help the Haitian people in the areas devastated by the recent hurricane and earthquake.

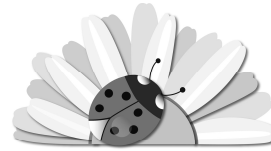
