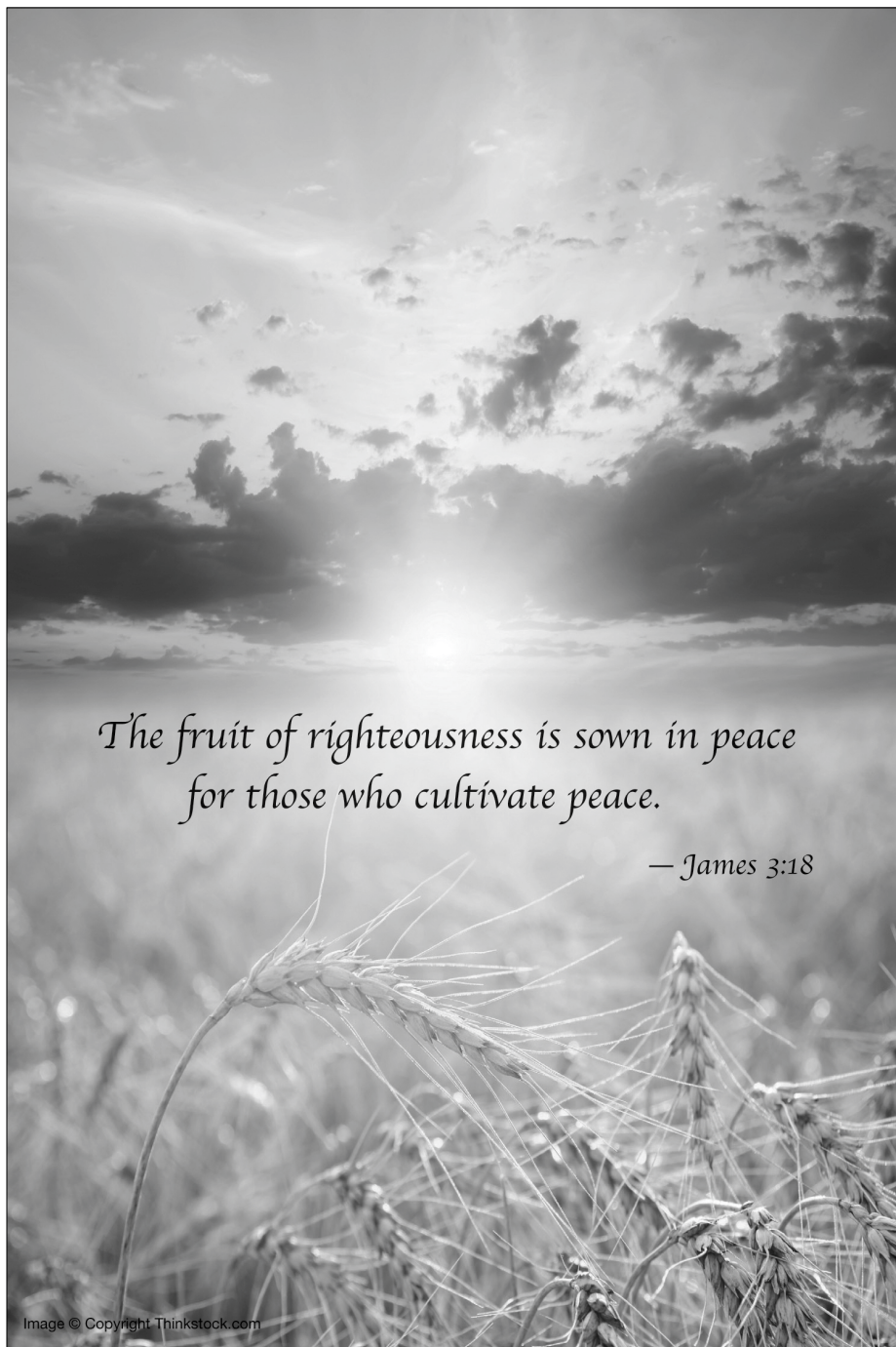

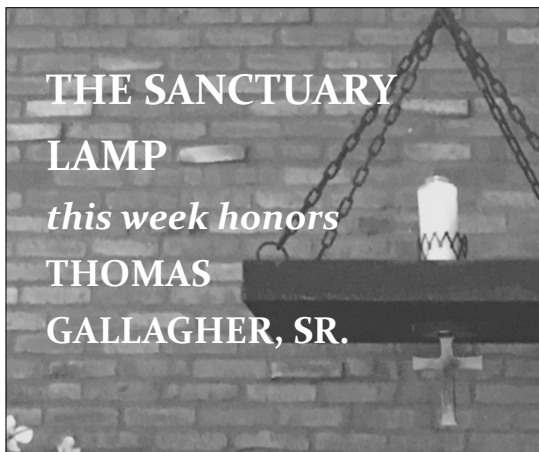

# Who is The Greatest?

*A Note from Fr. Landback*

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is again trying to prepare the disciples for His impending death and resurrection, but they do not understand and are afraid to ask Him about this. Ironically, what follows is a conversation amongst the disciples, not about Jesus' troubling words, but about which of them is greatest! Wow!

Jesus seizes this opportunity to teach them about true greatness. Greatness for a disciple of Jesus is found in service of others, not in perceived status. Jesus goes on to illustrate and stands a child in their midst and then embraces the child. (Yes, there were kids around when Jesus was teaching.) Jesus is telling us how to learn true greatness: observe the innocence and trust of a little child. He goes even further: "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

Receiving a child in His name can take many forms, whether we are single, married, parent, sibling, aunt, uncle, grandparent, godparent, teacher, mentor, coach, scoutmaster, etc. In cherishing, protecting and accepting a child in His name, we are embracing God and His priorities. After all, God is always embracing us as His children, no matter what age we happen to be.

# Leadership

One of the great church leaders of the 20th Century was Pope St. John XXIII (Angelo Roncalli). From very humble beginnings as a tenant farmer's son in Sotto el Monte, Italy, he became the Pope inaugurating the Second Vatican Council and opening the church to be viewed by religious leaders and governments worldwide. As he rose through the ranks of the Catholic Church, his kindness and concern for others worked hand in hand with obedience to the Popes that he served and his obedience to the will of God. He demonstrated that even as the Supreme Pontiff of the Roman Catholic Church he could reach out to people of other faiths, cultures, races and governments. This openness earned him the title of the “*good Pope.*”

During his pontificate, he reached out to peasants and princes alike. He sought to bring people together, to unite, no matter their economic status, church or government ranking. Unlike many popes that came from royalty and privilege, Pope John sought to be with people and talk with them. He often tried to sneak out of the Vatican and shake off the amenities that came with the papacy.

One such story was his escape one evening with the help of his valet who was severely reprimanded by Italian police because he was responsible for the pope's safety. The story goes that Pope John laughed at the whole incident. His kind smile and concern for others was evident right from the beginning of his papacy. His first duty as pope was to raise the salaries of all Vatican employees to enable them to properly support their families. Additionally, his visits to prisoners at a Roman prison and a children's hospital set the tone of his pontificate. This weekend's readings are a continuation of how to live a Christian life. Our first reading from the Book of Wisdom tells the story of how the wicked will try to trick people into doing wrong. They make a mockery of God coming to the aid of the person and rationalize their wickedness by saying God will help them. It is a test

of God's promise to be there for those who seek his help.



Our second reading continues St. James' reading from last week. The reading attacks ambition and jealousy, saying that wisdom is connected by acting out our faith for the good of others. Good behavior is a sign of a wise person trusting in God's guidance. True wisdom requires peace, mercy, and kindness. St. James addresses the issue of war by saying that war is the result of jealousy and discontent. War is the passionate pursuit of what others possess.

Our Gospel also continues from the previous week. The disciples were now journeying with Jesus to Capernaum. As they walked along, they argued. Jesus assumes it is about His persecution and death, but what he finds is their arguing about who among them is the greatest. He then embraces a child and tells the disciples they must be humble and unassuming as a young child. A person of wisdom sees the child as a symbol of simple obedience, willing to learn from the example of wise people and taking that knowledge and imitating it. Exalting oneself as someone of importance is fruitless, while humbling oneself means that people are continuing to seek out the needs of others.

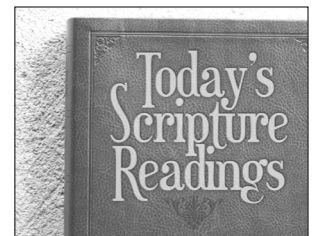

## Doxology and Amen

“Doxology” comes from a Greek word meaning “words of praise.” The Eucharistic Prayer ends with a doxology addressed to the triune God: “Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.” It is an exclamation of praise, honor, and glory to God, reminding us that we receive everything from God through the Son, in the power of the Spirit.

At the consecration, the priest held up the host and then the chalice for us to see and adore. During the doxology, the host and chalice are held up again, but this time they are held up and offered to God the Father. With the doxology, the Eucharistic Prayer ends, as it began, with words of praise addressed to the Father: truly, it is right and just to give God praise, and we assent to this in our whole-hearted acclamation, “Amen.” Never was more meaning packed into so short a word. —*Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. ## Calling All Young Adults!

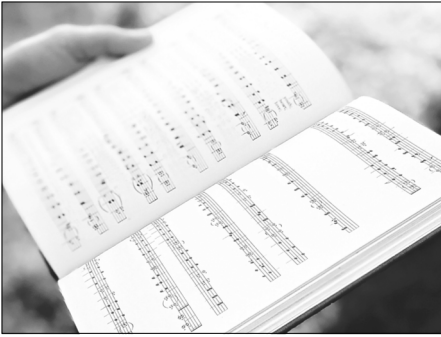
Crossroads 4 Christ (C4C) is a local lay apostolate working to develop and provide community for young adults.


