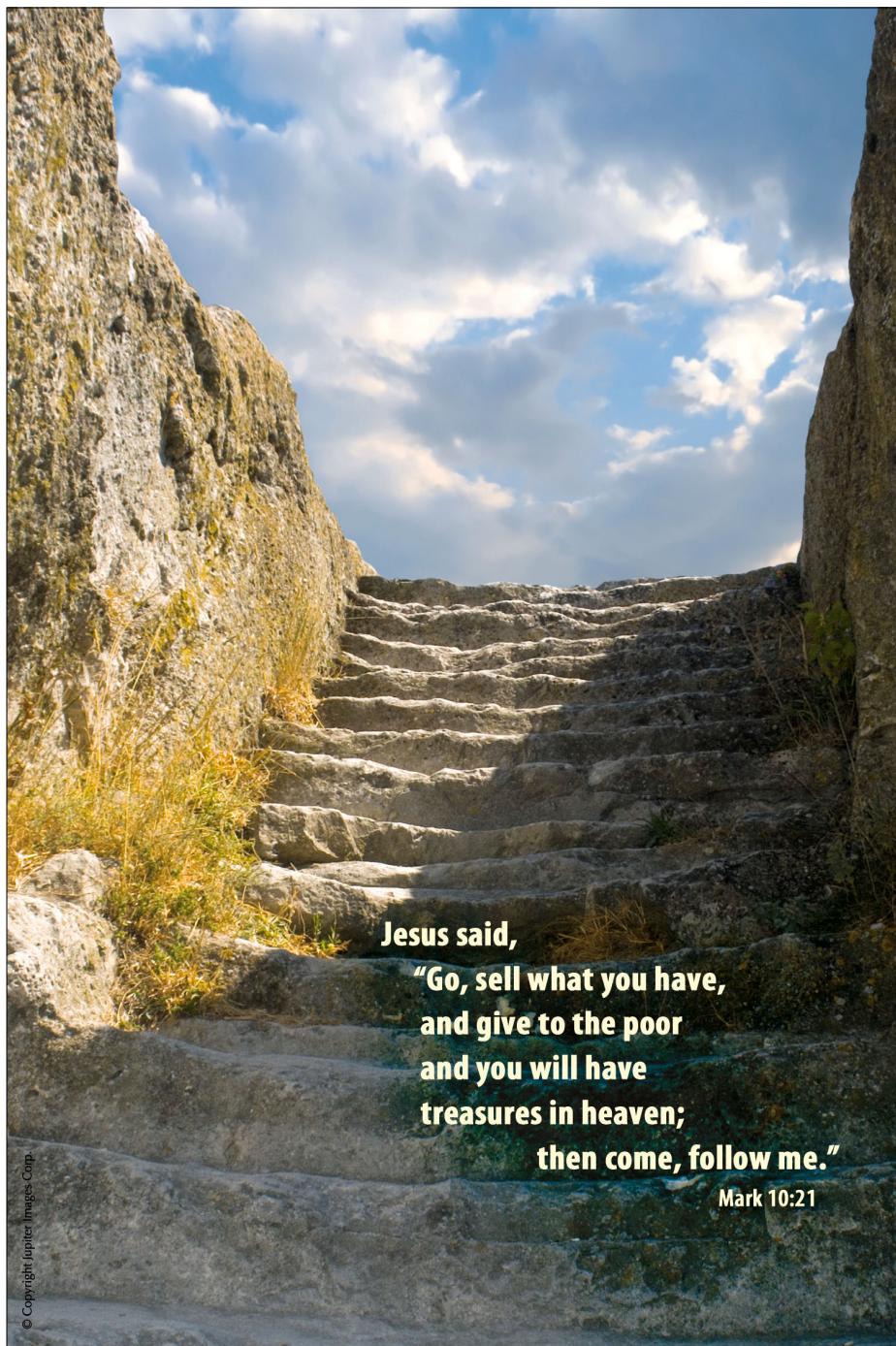

True Wisdom

A Note from Fr. Landback

Wisdom is the ability to make right judgments and right choices about things, to understand what is of ultimate value and what is only of passing value. Wisdom is the unifying theme of this week's scripture readings.



There is an enduring popularity to the film "It's a Wonderful Life" (made by Frank Capra, who was a practicing Catholic). The story is about George Bailey and his nemesis Mr. Potter. Bailey receives the grace to make the right choices despite the immediate cost to himself. Interestingly, this wisdom of George Bailey, which he is often tempted to give up, is shown in the movie to be connected to the Divine wisdom revealed in God's Word. (The second reading this week, from Hebrews, tells us: the Word of God is "living and effective...able to discern reflections and the thoughts of the heart...".)

In this week's Gospel we hear of an encounter between Jesus and a certain young man. This encounter is one of the most intriguing in the Gospels. The man asks Jesus "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answers the young man's question with a question: "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone."

Jesus is pointing to the true source of eternal life (and hinting at his own divinity).

The young man is very respectable and, it turns out, wealthy. But, there is something missing. Jesus puts His

finger on it: He is oriented toward himself, not God, nor his neighbor. Jesus tells him: "Sell what you have, give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then, come follow me." When Jesus speaks of treasure in heaven, he is not just referring to a reward after death. Heavenly treasure begins here and now and extends beyond this life.

In the dramatic climax of "It's a Wonderful Life," George Bailey (with the help of an angel) comes to see the heavenly treasures he has already received in return for those he gave up. Among them are a loving family, lasting friendships, and the satisfaction of having made a difference in other peoples' lives. True wisdom, then, means choosing heavenly treasure in the face of the pressure and temptation to do otherwise.

The Need for Understanding

There was a time when reading bumper stickers were a way of making a long road trip less boring. Sometimes they were funny and made you laugh; others promoted a specific politician or social cause; some even encouraged people to seek a state of mind.

And then some made you think. One that did that for me was, “HE WHO HAS THE MOST TOYS WINS.” On the surface, this saying promotes a form of competitiveness that says the more you accumulate in goods, the happier you’ll be. You will be perceived as a winner in the “game of life.” In fact, it points to a narcissism in which the individual focuses their entire life on tangible pleasures. It denotes a self-love in which the individual is in a race to feel s/he has beaten out friends in looking and dressing the best and having the best that money can buy.

This seems to be the way of life for many young people as they begin to mature. In my senior year of college, a friend and I toyed with the idea of renting a fancy European car for a short time to show everybody how important we were. Fortunately, this laughable dream never materialized. How often do we see young people -- and sometimes even older people -- chasing similar dreams of material superiority?

Our readings this weekend focus on just this idea. They look at those gathering wealth with little purpose other than to feel superior to those around them. Our first reading from the Book of Wisdom decries the accumulation of wealth instead of seeking God first in our life. The reading speaks to “wisdom” as the pursuit of experience, knowledge and good judgement and

places it above the accumulation of wealth. It promotes the ability to use good judgement for what we seek in life. As Christians, we should seek wisdom to understand God’s purpose and the good sense to imitate Jesus’ life for the good of others.

Our second reading from Hebrews tells us that the Word of God is a living tool which is appropriate for all ages. God’s Word reflects the times we live in. His Word is to be understood through the grace of wisdom. It gives us understanding and appropriately, the good judgement in how to use His Word for the good of others. Jesus, in our gospel, tells the ever-familiar story of the rich young man who is conflicted in trying to love God yet hold onto the wealth he has so tirelessly pursued. Unfortunately, the young man cannot let go because it is his mark of superiority and shows others how successful he is.

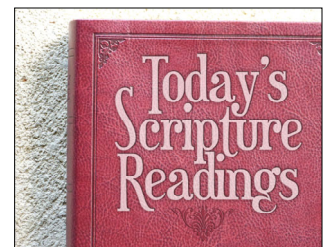
Jesus does not denounce those who have wealth. However, he rightfully understands that to have wealth oftentimes means placing one’s wealth and the pursuit of it ahead of knowing what God wants from us: to show kindness and caring for our brothers and sisters. He acknowledges the difficulty of untethering ourselves from our possessions. When we release ourselves from possessions which harness us, we begin to understand God.

First Reading — I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. All good things together came to me in her company (Wisdom 7:7-11).

Second Reading — Indeed the word of God is living and effective (Hebrews 4:12-13).

Gospel — It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God (Mark 10:17-30 [17-27]).
