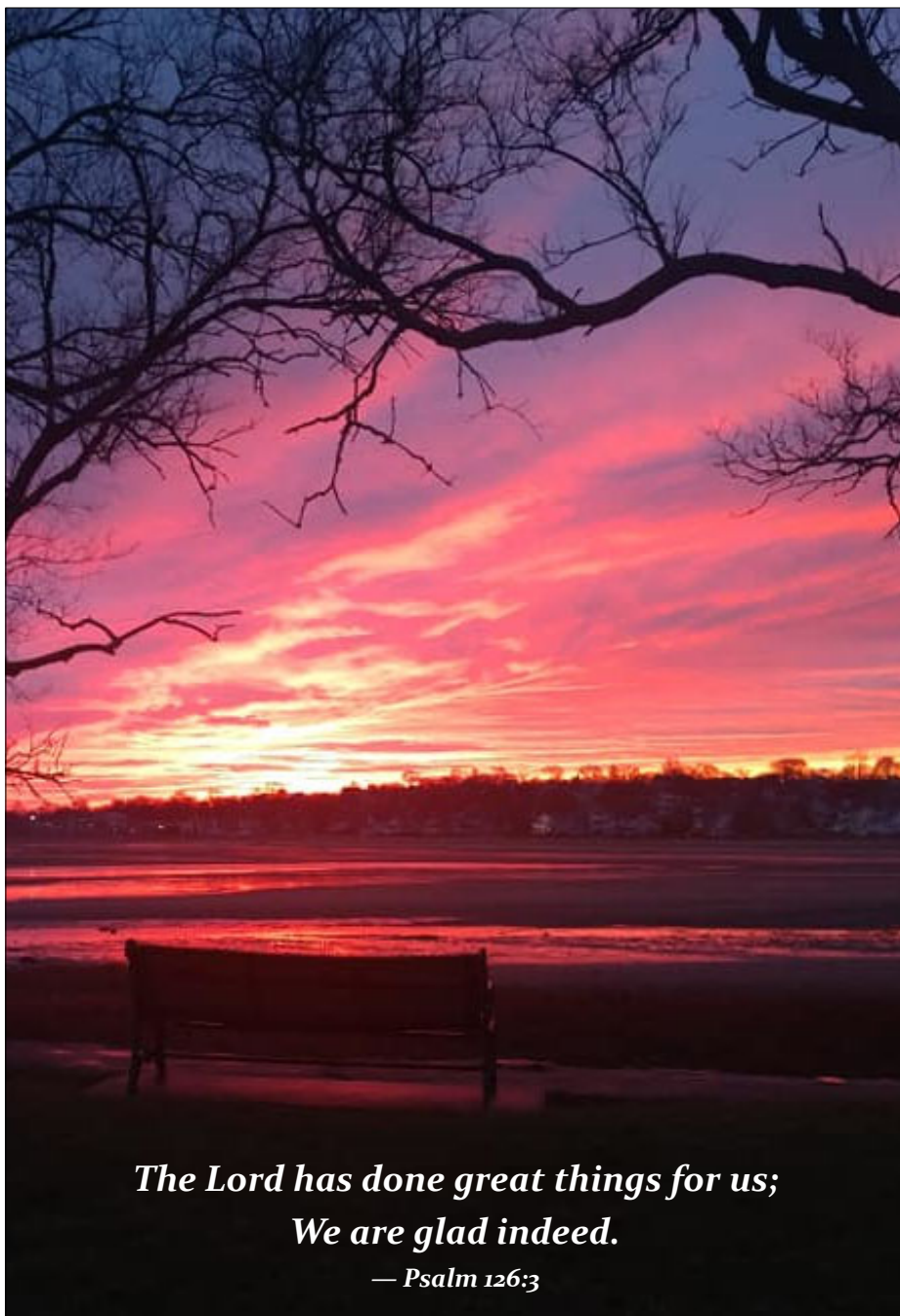

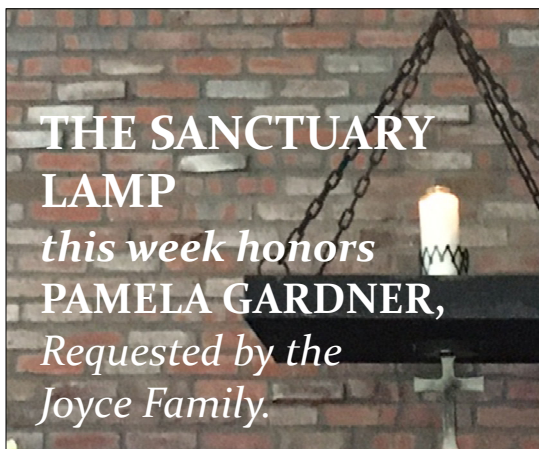

Our Parish Financial Council

A Note from Fr. Landback, Administrator

In this and coming articles, I plan to update you on our parish life. This week I am writing about the Parish Financial Council, which met on September 20. The names of our Trustees and Financial Council are now listed on page 2.

One of several topics discussed at the meeting on September 20, was the year-to-date financial condition of the parish, which thankfully has stabilized since the COVID-related restrictions on public worship were lifted. The Council also addressed the ongoing management of the proceeds from the sale of the former Our Lady of Victory property. Our goal in this is to have a portion of the funds for repairing and refurbishing our current campus as needed, while the greater portion is retained for future needs and contingencies.

The Council also decided to have a year-end Annual Collection, earmarking the gifts for repairs and renovations to the church buildings. Each household will receive a mailing later this week inviting you to participate.

- The following proposals were discussed:
- enhancing our electronic security system to include the church
 - correcting the foundation leaks that allow rain water into the church
 - refurbishing of the pews/replacement of the kneelers
 - refurbishing the floor in the church

The meeting was very hopeful. May God guide us as we seek to do His will! I will keep you posted on our progress.

A Look Into the Future

Sight opens a world of opportunities and provides one with hope for an expanding future of experiences. Lack of sight places limitations because the person may not be able to envision the future ahead. For example, with sight we can see the road ahead literally and figuratively. Obviously, riding in a car and seeing the road ahead defines the progress made to the intended destination. It helps the individual determine the additional time needed to get there.

Being able to see reveals the character or mood of the person who is talking as is evidenced by emails and texts which destroy this opportunity and are often misinterpreted. Without sight, people have a very difficult time distinguishing night from day and it can create an imbalance in their sleep habits.

Sight is also the ability to perceive future events. It allows a person to associate current and past events to reach some conclusions and future possibilities. For example, for many decades now science has been warning us of global warming, our lack of care for the environment and the effects of the use of certain fuels.

Another example, God has been dismissed by people lacking the vision to look through history and see God revealing Himself. People have also dismissed the vision of the prophets of God about what's coming for the world.

Our first reading from the Prophet Jere-

miah proclaims God's great news that His promise to the people of Israel is to return them to a land they had hoped and longed for. Along with the blind and the lame, God will return His people to their promised land.

Sometimes our expectations are high and lofty. We anticipate that salvation will come from places of honor and high esteem. St. Paul, in our second reading, sets us straight by emphasizing that those carrying the message of a better future are not the rich and famous, but those from the lowest of places who are humble and willing to serve God without any great fame.

Bartimaeus' lack of sight is a symbol of one unable to see God visually, but able to see God's presence in his soul. Bartimaeus is able to discern God in Jesus Christ. While his physical impairment is blindness, he seems to display an inner sight who knows Jesus is God and reaches out to Him in faith. His faith is unimpaired and he can see the future of Christ's person on earth. Jesus acknowledges Bartimaeus' great faith by returning his physical sight.

Those of us with unimpaired vision can clearly see the physical road ahead and all the many wonders God has to offer. We need to assess whether or not our faith is blinded by the many things of the world which betray Jesus' example and God's presence.

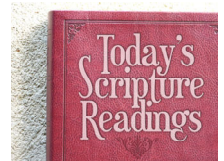

Learning About the Mass: The Sound of Communion

The priest receives Holy Communion, and then there is movement, a bustle of activity, as we prepare to join the Communion procession. This holy meal does not happen in silence!

Instead, we sing together even as we rise and move forward in procession to the altar. We do not receive the sacrament in silence, but with a dialogue that is also a profession of faith: “The Body of Christ.” “Amen.” “The Blood of Christ.” “Amen.” We acknowledge the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist with our “Amen” of faith, but more, our “Amen” is also a prayer that we may become what we receive, the Body of Christ, living and active in the world. We receive him so that we may become a part of him—part, too, of all the others who receive him, the whole communion of believers.





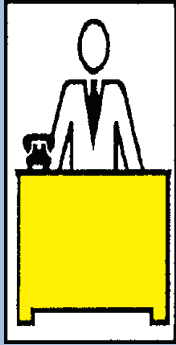
