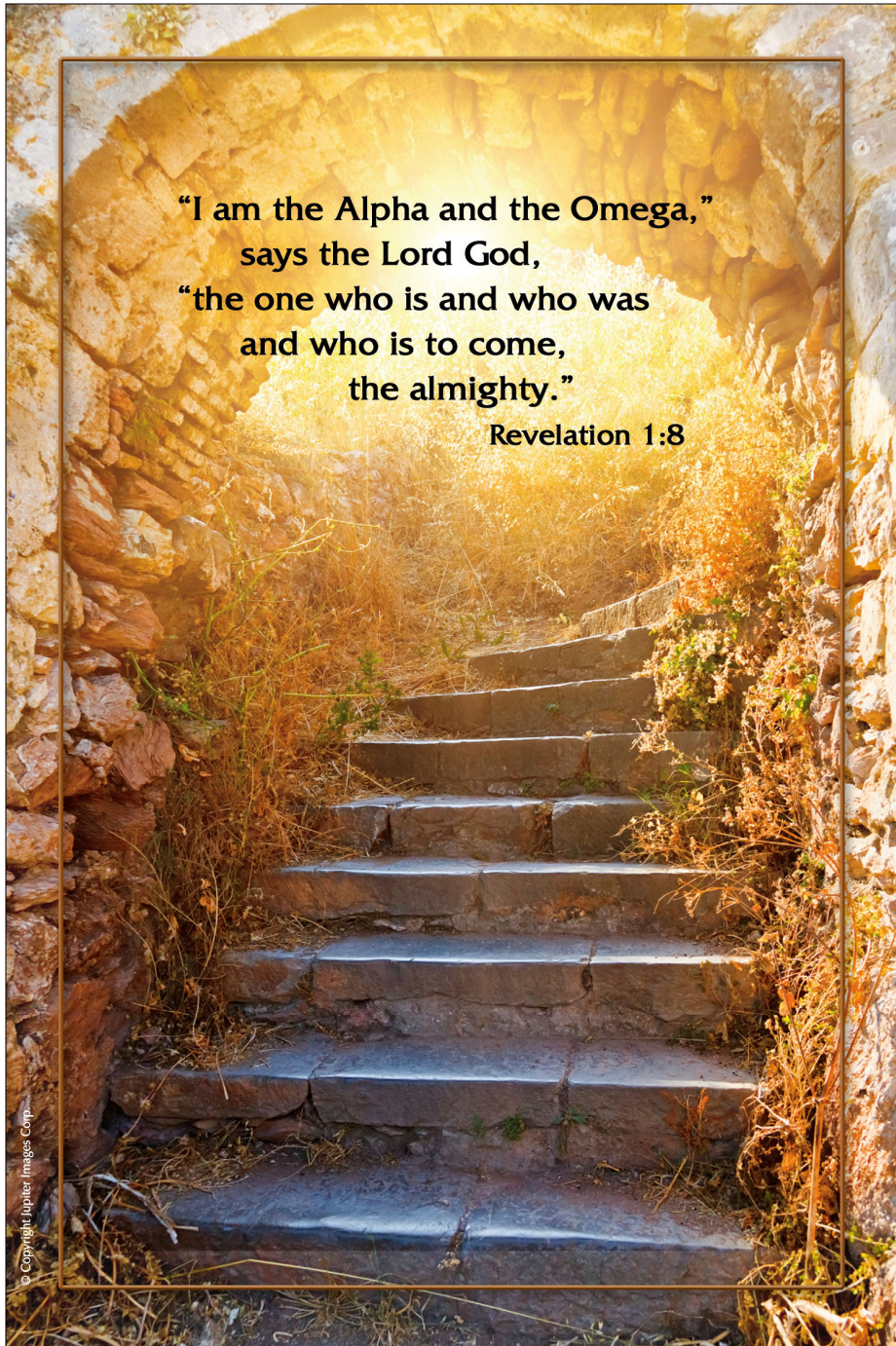

# Christ's Kingship

*A Note from Fr. Landback, Administrator*

Today we celebrate the last Sunday of our yearly cycle of Eucharistic worship. We do so with a great celebration of Jesus, the King of the Universe. I would like you to consider the sort of king Jesus claimed himself to be and to invite you to reflect on your relationship to His Kingship. My hope is that you enthusiastically place yourself under His Kingship today and always.

In today's Gospel, we read a segment of the interrogation of Jesus by Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor. It is an odd interrogation because it quickly becomes clear that, while Jesus is the one on trial, it is Pilate who is clearly on the defensive. His lead question is: "Are you the King of the Jews?" Pilate wants to know whether Jesus claims the allegiance of the Jewish people to exercise an ethnic or "tribal" leadership. If so, it would be a threat to Pilate and to the Romans. Jesus answers with a question. He asks Pilate to clarify his own stake in this: Do you really want to know the truth? Pilate answers, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own people and the chief priests hand you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus informs Pilate of the nature of His Kingdom: "My kingdom does not belong to this world." If it did, "my followers would be fighting" to free their King. His kingdom is not the sort of which Pilate is thinking. Pilate, trying to regain control of this conversation, asks, "Then you are a king?"

"King" is the title Pilate keeps using, but (as Jesus explains) His Kingship is not the same kind to which Pilate refers. He tells Pilate: "I was born and came into the world to testify to the truth." That is, the truth about God and the human race. The response of each person to Jesus' "testimony" reveals what is in that person. Whoever is on the side of truth will hear His voice. Jesus is the King of those who seek the truth, no matter what the cost. In the next verse, which falls outside our reading for today, Pilate skeptically asks Jesus, "What is truth?"

Jesus shone a bright light into Pilate's soul that day and He will do that for each of us at whatever stage of our life we find ourselves. Pilate was skeptical that there is any such thing as truth, a truth to which every other claim must submit. (However, Pilate **did** try to free Jesus before bowing to political expediency!) As we approach the beginning of Advent next week, are we willing to allow Jesus to shine the light of His Truth into our souls?

# The Unexpected King

As we come to the end of the liturgical year, we celebrate Christ as the King of all. His journey to Jerusalem in the gospels of the past few weeks show that many people came to believe in Him. Having witnessed miracles and heard Jesus speak, they expressed their faith in many ways. His use of parables and metaphors enabled many to understand His teachings in a manner that they could relate to everyday life.

Yet there were those who still did not believe His message. There were those who continually tried to trip Him up in contradicting the Laws handed down to Moses by God. Yet in the simplicity of His teachings, He focuses on the two great commandments continually; love of God and love for our neighbor. He spoke of the need for all, both rich and poor, to set aside their desire for greatness and success and reach out and help those in need. He praised the efforts of the poor, who even in their own lowered economic state, gave what they could out of their meager earnings to help those in need.

He encouraged all to bear much fruit in their everyday actions by being selfless and becoming aware of the needs of others. He used the fig tree to demonstrate the need to bear fruit in our everyday life and reminded us of God's displeasure with those who waste their life on pursuing greatness and success.

However, Jesus was not the kind of king the people were looking for: the warrior king that would suppress the power of the Romans. He was not the king to lead the Jewish people into battle nor stand up to King Herod and the Roman powers. He was the King to bring the message of God the Father; recognizing the needs of all people; even those who opposed the Jewish people politically or spiritually.

Our first reading from the Prophet Daniel this weekend speaks of a king of justice. "But the wise will shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament; those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever." The words from God that Daniel hears foretells of Christ the King

and all those who follow Him and they emphasize the dominance of Jesus as the Son of Man. Our second reading from Revelation reminds us that Jesus' death is the eternal payment for all sin. It is Jesus who allows all of us to inherit the kingdom of God; His sacrifice is for all and for all time. His kingdom is now and lasts through all eternity with God our Father.

For many weeks now we have seen the Pharisees trying to trick Jesus into incorrectly applying Jewish law to His words and actions. Our Gospel on this Feast of Christ the King seems to reverse the roles previously encountered by Jesus. It is Jesus who answers the question by asking Pilate a question. It seems that Pilate is now on the defensive, citing that He is not a Jew and that He is only doing what has been asked by the chief priests. Jesus responds that His kingdom is not of this world but the Kingdom of Heaven. Perhaps it is Jesus' response that solidified Jesus' ultimate death. Perhaps Pilate did not understand and he realized no land can survive with two kings.

As Christians we believe Jesus' words that say the Kingdom of God is now, here on earth. We might ask the question of ourselves: How do we promote the Kingdom of God in our everyday life on Earth? Hopefully, we too, can be accused of promoting justice and equality for all.
