The Greatest Gift of All

A Note from Fr. Landback, Administrator

The Gospel last week included this prophecy by John the Baptist about the coming of Jesus Christ: “There is one coming after me the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.” This Sunday’s Gospel shows us how that very prophecy was fulfilled in John’s own life while he was still in his mother’s womb. John said this baptism of the Spirit will cause a separation of the “wheat and chaff” in our lives: that which is true and of eternal value is separated from that which is not. The Holy Spirit in a person’s life brings holiness, the indwelling of God.

In today’s Gospel, we hear about the “Visitation.” Mary had been told by the Angel Gabriel that she would conceive the Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit and must name Him Jesus. Gabriel also revealed to Mary that her cousin Elizabeth was six-months pregnant with John the Baptist. Mary immediately traveled to the home of Elizabeth.

Upon Mary’s greeting as she enters her cousin’s house, two things immediately happen: John leaps for joy in Elizabeth’s womb, and Elizabeth is “filled” with the Holy Spirit. She begins to “prophecy,” that is, she speaks words inspired by the Holy Spirit, words that come not only from her own mind but from the mind of God: “Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb.” These are among the most repeated words in all of history since they are part of the Hail Mary. Elizabeth expresses

humility at the honor of receiving “the mother of my Lord.” She pronounces Mary blessed because she believed the Word of God brought to her by the Angel. Mary had acted upon her belief in coming to visit Elizabeth.

Brothers and sisters, the central purpose for which Jesus is sent into the world is for us to receive the Holy Spirit. It was already happening while He was still in Mary’s womb! Jesus is “God with us,” who can impart to us His Spirit. There are sure signs of God’s Spirit in Mary, John the Baptist, and his mother Elizabeth: joy, humility, gratefulness, boldness to speak the Word of God and to act upon it in faith.

When we receive God’s Spirit into our lives, there is new power available. Conscience is sensitized and our will is strengthened to obey God. We become more generous, honest, humble, modest, chaste, faithful. We still have our struggles, but we have a new source of help to deal with them. The Holy Spirit is the Christmas gift “that keeps on giving” our whole life long. Jesus is the One who comes bearing the Father’s precious gift!

New Beginnings With a Child-Like Faith

As we enter the final week of Advent, the excitement of Christmas is upon us. The music of the season fills the air, with sights of the season and words of peace and joy everywhere.

As Christians, we anticipate the birth of the Christ child. The coolness of the winter air allows for a freshness that welcomes this excitement and a new year. As with the anticipation of the birth of any baby, we welcome the feeling of a new beginning. A birth yet untouched by the challenges of life on Earth.

Perfection, beauty, and serenity all come together to welcome this new beginning with the joy and hope of a new day; an opportunity to dispose of the old and welcome the new. We frequently long for a new beginning -- a chance to start anew, a rebirth. In this season of the Nativity of our Lord, we can find that new beginning in welcoming the Christ Child into our lives. We can make it different from years past by showing our full commitment to the Good News Christ has brought into the world.

I am writing this on the day before the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. A feast misunderstood by many, but a feast which sets in place the reality that Mary brings into the world the Son of God. She could only do so without sin herself. We can only truly celebrate the birth of Jesus by acknowledging Mary, the Mother of God, as the mother of us all.

Our gospel on this fourth Sunday of Advent is the beautiful story of Mary's encounter with her cousin Elizabeth, who is pregnant with John the Baptist. He is the precursor sent into the world to "prepare the way" for Christ, the Anointed. What a beautiful encounter between two women about to give birth! Their joy for each other is echoed by the response of their children and the love for each other as cousins. History does not record the age of Mary when she gave birth to Jesus, but tradition holds that she was in her early teens: 13-15 years old. A mere child herself giving birth to the Christ child. Elizabeth, much older in age, about to give birth to

the one who will mark the end of the Old Covenant God had made with the Jewish people. Mary is the bearer of the New Covenant, God's "Word made flesh."

Jesus, throughout His lifetime, celebrated children and spoke often of them. He told us we must be like children to inherit the Kingdom of God. This is the season where we celebrate the child in us all and we should never lose sight of this. Children live in the pure faith and hope of a better tomorrow. They don't dwell on what has been, but what will be. Jesus, in a sense, never dwelled on the past but lived in the Promise of the Father for an eternal tomorrow. During this season, let's look forward -- as our children do -- to a tomorrow filled with hope, joy and peace.

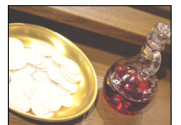


